2025 HOME AND FAMLY ARTS OPEN SHOW GENERAL POLICIES

Who May Enter

- Residents of all ages from Tippecanoe County <u>and</u> surrounding counties.
- Exhibitors may NOT enter classes/divisions in which the exhibit is their main source of income. Exceptions are Fine Arts Professional Skill Level and Long Arm Professional Quilting, Class VIII.
- **4-H members may enter the Open Show** but cannot exhibit the same item in both 4-H and the Open Show in the same year.
- All entries will be judged on quality and not by age, except where age is indicated in the requirements for the class/division.

Entry Information

- Each exhibitor is limited to two exhibits per numbered entry section.
- All work must be entirely that of the exhibitor.
- Exhibits must have been made within the past three years (for this year 2022 to present), unless specified otherwise.
- Items exhibited in past Tippecanoe County Home and Family Arts Open Shows are NOT eligible for re-entry.
- Articles should be entered and exhibited as they are to be used.
- Each entry should include a 3x5 explanation card. (ex. location of picture, hours involved in project, patterns, kits, where you came up with the idea, how are you using the item or other interesting facts)
- Entries will be disqualified that are in bad taste.
- Soiled items will be refused/not displayed.
- No article can be exhibited with a sales tag and/or business card.
 - The entry form has a space for you to indicate your interest in releasing your contact information to a person interested in your exhibit. Any sales will be made between exhibitor and prospective buyer.

JUDGING

- <u>ONLY</u> Foods, Flowers and Gardening judging are open to the public.
- Names of participants are covered during judging.
- Judging is done by qualified, experienced judges.
- Judges will not award placings to unworthy exhibits, whether there is competition or not.
- The Open Show Committee may move any item from one entry number to another if the item is believed to be entered incorrectly.

Awards

- All Foods, Flowers, and Gardening awards will be presented at judging; all other award winners will receive their awards at exhibit checkout.
- Sweepstakes, Reserve Sweepstakes, Champions, Reserve Champions, and other awards will be given as listed in each division and as determined by the judge.
 - Placings will be determined based upon the quality of each entry.
 - Stickers are used instead of ribbons on exhibits.
 - o If you desire a Ribbon, remember to pick it up at exhibit checkout

The following rules apply to ALL Photography classes unless indicated otherwise:

CLASSES I-V

- Each photograph must be between 8" x 10" and 11" x 14" and printed horizontally or vertically.
- Each photograph must be individually dry-mounted or matted on a standard 16" x 20" salon mount board*** and displayed VERTICALLY.

ALL CLASSES

- Each photograph must be covered with clear plastic or a plastic photo sleeve*** to protect the image.
- Name of exhibitor/any form of identification should **NOT** be displayed anywhere on the entry.
- Photos in frames/glass will be disqualified.
- Proper identification tags will be provided at exhibit check-in.
- Due to liability issues, exhibitors should only enter photos of close friends and family who have given their consent to be photographed; questionable entries will be disqualified.
- Judges will consider the following:
- Storytelling ability (impact, feeling/emotion created)
- Composition (arrangement of elements, center of interest)
- Print quality (contrast/color, exposure, clarity)
- Presentation quality (mounting, matting, plastic sleeve/covering)



QUILTING SKILL LEVELS:

- BEGINNER: Exhibitor who has made 10 or fewer quilts or wall hangings (ONCE PLACED AS A SWEEPSTAKES WINNER IN BEGINNER CLASSES, EXHIBITORS MUST ENTER EXPERIENCED CLASSES)
- EXPERIENCED: Exhibitor who has made more than 10 quilts or wall hangings, or has won a previous Quilting Division Sweepstakes award
- > PROFESSIONAL: Exhibitor whose main source of income is quilting

QUILTING DIVISION POLICIES:

- Quilts may be exhibited ONLY ONE TIME in the Home and Family Arts Open Show
- All quilts must have a label (exception: Class IX—Antique Quilts)
- Labels must be attached to the exhibit (sewn on, pinned on, embroidered on, written by permanent marker)
 Size and placement of label to be determined by exhibitor.
- Label must have name of quilt or pattern, maker's name, completion date, name of quilter.
 - Names of exhibitors will be covered during judging.
- Quilts in the Home and Family Arts Open show ARE NOT automatically entered in the Indiana State Fair Quilting competition; it is the exhibitor's responsibility to do this.

 - > Cookies, Muffins, Rolls, and candy pieces Exhibit 6 on a plate
- All Foods exhibits and recipes become the property of the Home and Family Arts Committee, except for Food Preservation exhibits.
- A portion of each exhibit will be plated and displayed. The remainder of the food product will be sold at the Baked Goods Auction following the judging of food preservation.
- Proceeds from the Baked Goods Auction support the Open Show.
- Class I (Kooking for Kids) will be the first class to be judged.

ALL FOOD EXHIBITS MUST FOLLOW PURDUE UNIVERSITY FOOD SAFETY GUIDELINES:

- Filling, frosting, glazing, pie filling, and meringue (whether cooked or uncooked) are NOT PERMITTED to contain cream cheese, sour cream, heavy cream, or whipped cream, as the nature of these products increases the moisture content and water activity of the food.
- Foods with a higher moisture content and water activity can be ideal growing conditions for food borne pathogens, even if the ingredient is part of a batter and baked.
- Additionally, raw milk, raw milk products or uncooked eggs/egg whites are not permitted.
- Eggs/egg whites that have been cooked to 160 degrees Fahrenheit (i.e. pasteurized or included as part of a batter and baked) are acceptable.
- No home-canned fruits, vegetables, or meats are permitted in products.
- Exhibitors should carefully wash their hands and make sure their hands do not have any open cuts before preparing food.
 - Exhibitors should not prepare food exhibits for competition within 48 hours of recovery from any illness.
- Whenever possible, baked products should be transported in chilled coolers (41 degrees Fahrenheit).
