

#### **Warning Signs of a Heart Attack**

- 1. Pain or discomfort in chest
- Lightheadedness, nausea, or vomiting
  - 3. Jaw, neck, or back pain
- 4. Discomfort or pain in arm or shoulder
  - 5. Shortness of Breath

# Use the F.A.S.T. Warning Signs to spot a Stroke

- 1. F = Face Drooping
- 2. A = Arm Weakness
- 3. S = Speech Difficulty
- 4. T = Time to call 911

## Marshmallow Crème Fudge

¾ of Butter

1 bag of Chocolate Chips

Nuts optional

3 cup Sugar

1 cup of Milnot

1-7 oz of Marshmallow Creme

Mix sugar and Milnot and ingredient's and cook until mixture it comes to a boil, Stirring frequently. Boil for five mixtures stirring constantly. Remove from the fire and stir in the Chocolate chips and Marshmallow crème. Stir the mixture until it is creamy and smooth. Pour into a buttered 9x9 pan. Allow it to cool. Cut as desired. Yields 2½ pounds. Can use butterscotch chips. You can add mint too.


