Purdue Extension- Tipton County Office by  
Thursday, May 15, 2025**

All 4-H rabbit exhibitors must submit a sheet identifying all of the rabbits they want eligible to show at the Tipton County 4-H Fair. The black mailbox on the sidewalk in front of the Purdue Extension- Tipton County office building is a locked drop box that is checked every business day; feel free to put your completed papers in this box if it is more convenient to drop them off after regular business hours.

\*\*Since the Hare Raisers 4-H Club is meeting on May 15, you may submit your ID papers at that meeting and still meet the deadline.

Please complete all ID pieces of information for each rabbit.

If your rabbits need tattooed, please contact Lynn Calloway at (765) 776-1825 BEFORE Friday, May 9 to make arrangements to have your animal tattooed.

All animal exhibitors (beef, goat, poultry, rabbit, sheep, swine) are required to complete Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) OR Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care (4-HQLC) each year. YQCA can be completed online at <https://yqcaprogram.org> for \$12. YQCA is recommended if you plan to show at any open or large national shows. Indiana 4-H is no longer affiliated with YQCA- any questions need to be referred to YQCA.

4-HQLC will be offered in-person a few times before the fair, including the May 15 Hare Raisers/Feathered Friends 4-H Club meeting. Please see the enclosed flyer for details.

Rabbits will arrive to the fair between 8-10 a.m. on Wednesday, July 16. The 4-H Rabbit Show will take place at 2 p.m. on Friday, July 18. The Small Animal Supreme Showmanship Contest will take place on Saturday, July 19 at 6 pm. Rabbits will be released at the conclusion of the Large Animal Supreme Showmanship Contest on Sunday, July 20.

Activity Record Sheets are no longer required for Indiana 4-H livestock projects. If you wish to complete the project and are not able to exhibit then you may complete a record sheet and submit it to the office for your project to be considered complete. Although completing learning activities from project manuals is no longer required, it is still highly encouraged to help the 4-Her learn more about their project.
