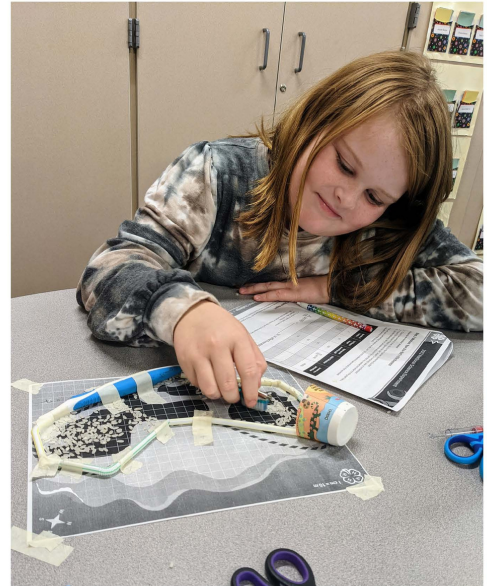

Mini 4-H members should list 'Mini 4-H' as their club

Each member is responsible to pay a \$15 program fee upon enrollment (maximum \$45/family; fee does not apply to Mini 4-Hers). It is preferred you use the secure online payment method. If you already have a card entered from previous years make sure it is the correct card and/or has not expired since last year.

Swine tags for State Fair Exhibitors Available- pick up by May 13

All swine that will be entered for the Indiana State Fair will need to be identified in 4-H Online with ear notches and an RFID number. RFID tags are available to purchase in the Purdue Extension Office for \$3; DNA hair sample collection envelopes are also available and required for ISF entry. Please pick up these items by 4 pm on Friday, May 13 if you plan to enter or exhibit at the Indiana State Fair.



Livestock Identification Deadline- May 16

All beef, sheep, goats, swine, and horse and pony projects must be enrolled in 4-H Online by May 16. Please do not wait until May 16 to start this process.

Rabbit and Pocket Pet identification forms are due to the Purdue Extension Office by May 16.

Poultry identification forms are due to the Purdue Extension Office by June 1.

Project Add/Drop Deadline- May 16

4-Hers have the chance to add or drop projects in their 4-H Online profile until May 16. Please check what projects you are enrolled in; if you aren't enrolled in a project, it won't show up on your list when you enter projects in FairEntry in June!

Congratulations to State Accomplishment Scholarship Winners

Any 4-H members in grade 10-freshman year of college may apply for 4-H Accomplishment Scholarships in the winter. Applicants prepare a cover letter and resume highlighting the life skills they learned in certain project areas. Finalists participate in a professional interview very similar to what one may experience in a professional setting. Two youth who have been involved in Tipton County 4-H received 4-H Accomplishment Scholarships this year.

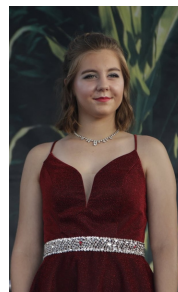
Madison Powell- \$2000 Premier Achievement Scholarship

All livestock exhibitors (beef, sheep, swine, goats, rabbit, and poultry) are required to participate in the YQCA quality assurance educational program. Dates of face-to-face instruction are listed above. The program must be completed by the time you get pen assignments on July 9, with either the face-to-face or online option (you only need to do one). This program is designed to help 4-Hers understand their role in the food animal industry and help them learn how to promote the livestock industry.

The YQCA system changed in March. You will need to go to the county 4-H website and see the help documents under the 'County Livestock Project' menu, or under the "More Info" menu on the YQCA website, to see how to create a new account and register for a training. All Instructor Lead Trainings are open and available for registration- please do that BEFORE you come to the training.

2022 4-H Events Fair Schedule

We are excited to announce the schedule of 4-H events for the 2022 Tipton County 4-H Fair! It is different than the past, but now that we are moving out of quarantine and more stability this will likely be the framework for future fairs.

The Fair Board is finalizing plans for the community and entertainment events that will take place during the fair. The full fair program will be available very soon, but we wanted to get dates and times for 4-H events out ASAP.

Thank you to the 4-H Council and Fair Board members who worked together to come up with this schedule.

Livestock Premium Auction Announcement

The Auction Committee has made the decision to continue to allow Auction animals to remain in the possession and ownership of the 4-Her if that is the preference of the 4-Her. An Out-Truck option will be available for swine and goats/sheep during the fair with a sign-up sheet to indicate that decision. Beef exhibitors should be in communication with Greg Sottong as soon as possible if they want to sell their animals for market price versus keeping them. As a reminder, any animal signed up for the auction will be ineligible for state fair. Dates and times for market livestock "out trucks" have not yet been determined. With the exception of non-sale swine (which will be released on Wednesday night) and cow-calf pairs (in and out on the day of the show), no non-sale animals will be released until the conclusion of Supreme Showmanship on Saturday evening without the formal approval of a written request submitted to 4-H Council prior to the 4-H Fair.

Sheep and Goat ID Night- Wednesday, May 11, 5-7 pm

All sheep and goat exhibitors should have received a letter about ID night. All market meat goats (wethers and market does), market lambs (wethers and market ewes) and commercial ewes must come to receive ear tags required for 4-H identification. Registered ewes are encouraged to attend to get RFID tags, but they can also be purchased in the office if they already have a form of ID that matches a registration paper.

4-H Project Guidelines are now available!

EVERY 4-H project has updated guidelines- take some time to read the options available for your project and division/level!

extension.purdue.edu/county/tipton/tipton-county-4-h.html

Scroll down to "4-H Program Information"

- "County Projects" has documents for the non-animal projects that are exhibited at Tipton County but don't go to the State Fair (except for Arts & Crafts, which can go to the State Fair).

- "State Projects" will take you to pages for projects that are eligible to move on to the State Fair; check out the "Additional County Information for State Projects" link for important information. Every county in Indiana will follow the exact same guidelines for State Fair projects.

- "County Livestock Projects" has information for all animal projects offered in Tipton County.

- You can also find old newsletters, enrollment information, resources, and scholarship applications under "Membership," "Important Information," and "Tipton County Clover Newsletters."

So what is new?- We are moving away from *"rules and requirements"* to *"suggestions and guidelines."* Youth should be able to explore topics and express their gifts, talents, and interests without so much regulation. Youth should still learn information at a level they understand and build on skills from year to year. Projects should still show skills that are age appropriate. But if you're in Foods A and don't like muffins, but have a great recipe for brownies then you can make brownies!

Why have these changed? We want kids to learn about a topic and create a project without so many restrictions. Have you ever been marked down on a project because of a requirement that didn't really have anything to do with your learning goals (aside from the argument that we are trying to teach kids how to read and understand rules)? I'll never forget the year an elementary student was marked down because the display case that a family member made was an inch too wide because of a discrepancy in how the "rules" on display size were interpreted. How frustrating for everyone involved, especially the youth who had great content in his project! Luckily the youth went on to be a 10 year 4-H member, and his parents continued volunteering for the program, but for many others those rules would be a barrier that would keep them from enrolling again. Suggestions have been offered for many project areas, but these suggestions are for reference and not a RULE that can be used to mark down a project. *Exception is that posters should still be the standard size, have a stiff backing, and be covered with plastic, and all foods projects should follow safety guidelines.*

Major changes- Arts and Crafts- Lego and Ag Education (farm displays) are now combined in **Arts and Crafts- Construction and Architectural Replica**. This means that a farm display from Tipton County could go to the State Fair, when before it was a county only project.

Foods- If displaying multiple samples of a product (cookies, muffins, biscuits, etc.) and plan to be in the Foods Auction, you will bring two sets of items. One set will be your best three items to be used for judging, and the second set will be six additional items that will be auctioned.
