Open 4-H Council Positions

There are two open positions on 4-H Council. 4-H Council is the policy and procedure board that directs the Tipton County 4-H program. Regular meetings are held at 6:30 pm on the second Tuesday of most months at the Purdue Extension- Tipton County Office. The group works closely with the 4-H Youth Development Extension Educator.

One Open Adult Position- Adult terms are 3 years, with an option to be re-elected to a second 3 year term for a total of serving 6 years. Must complete the 4-H Volunteer application process, be a Tipton County resident, and have an interest in the 4-H program. It is NOT a requirement to have a youth in the program.

One Open Youth Position- Youth terms are two years with no re-election. Candidates should be currently enrolled in 4-H, at least 16 years old with at least two years left in 4-H, and have reliable transportation to meetings. Youth have equal voice and voting rights as adult Council members.

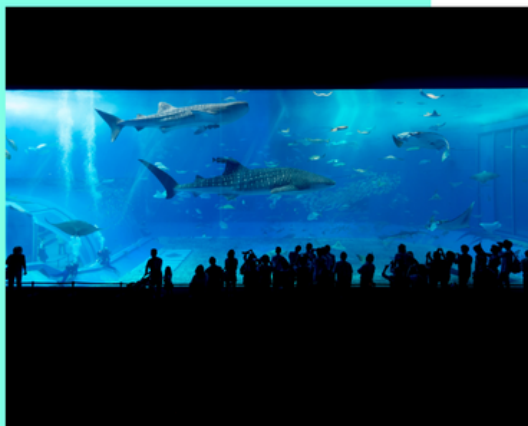
