All posters, notebooks, and display boards must include a reference list indicating where information was obtained, giving credit to the original author, to complete the 4-H member's exhibit. This reference list should/might include web site links, people and professionals interviewed, books, magazines, etc. It is recommended this reference list be attached to the back of a poster or display board, be the last page of a notebook, or included as part of the display visible to the public. A judge is not to discredit an exhibit for the way references are listed.

The front of the notebook is to include the 4-H member's name, county, club, and level. Personal information such as phone number, mailing address, etc. should not be included in any notebook documentation.

Exhibit Class Guidelines:

Beginner (grades 3-5 suggested)

Create a notebook for a trip you planned and prepared. Be sure to include the map of the route, a personal budget, individual packing list, other relevant items or information about your trip.

Intermediate (grades 6-8 suggested)

Create a notebook for a trip you planned and prepared. Be sure to include the map of the route, trip itinerary, family or group budget, individual packing list, any other relevant items or information about your trip.

Advanced (grades 9-12 suggested)

Create a notebook for a trip you planned and prepared. Be sure to include the map of the route, itinerary, the family or group budget (including a cost comparison of at least one expense category, ie. method of travel), family or group packing list, a checklist to get ready to go, any other relevant items or information about your trip.
