In January Brian Howell (4H & Youth Development) and I were fortunate to deliver Captain Cash to Tipton Elementary 3rd graders. We spent our time delivering lessons and activities to the students in Mrs. Rich's, Mrs. McElfresh's, Mrs.

Bitner's, Mrs. Delph's, and Mrs. Ripberger's classes, respectively. In total, 108 third graders learned about earning, saving, spending and borrowing money through four different sessions.

Captain Cash is an interactive educational program designed to teach basic financial management skills to your students. Along with learning basic financial concepts, students learn and practice important life skills to foster self-sufficiency such as communication, decision-making, problem-solving, managing resources, planning, and organizing.



4-H Families use Online Programs for 4-H Enrollment

All 4-H families will use 4-H Online and FairEntry. This chart will hopefully help people understand why we use the different systems.

One thing this chart doesn't mention: when enrolling in projects in 4-H Online you only need to enroll in the category, but not the specific project? Can't find Candlemaking? Enroll in Arts & Crafts. Black and White Salon Print?

Photography. It is in FairEntry that you will declare what specific projects you are doing.

4-H Online is open now. You can add and drop projects until May 15. If there is any chance your 4-Her will complete a project, sign up for it. There is no penalty for projects not completed.

FairEntry will open in mid-June. Only the projects for which you are enrolled in 4-H Online will show up in FairEntry- so be sure to enroll in your projects in 4-H Online by May 15!!!

County 4-H Website is Updated

The majority of documents are updated on the Tipton County 4-H website. This includes the 4-H Family Guide, convenient check lists, and animal enrollment information and vaccination forms.

There are very few project guideline updates- mostly in Arts & Crafts. Those should be posted by March 1 and won't affect the kind of projects you can exhibit.

TCSC SHARE TABLES

This month I am happy to bring you some wonderful news in regard to our Tipton schools. Dr. Glaze has approved the implementation of share tables to serve as a food rescue initiative, and we hope to get this project up and running this spring. A share table will allow certain foods to be donated to fellow students and the Boys and Girls Club while adhering to safety regulations. Food waste continues to be a persistent problem in the United States and I am so excited that we will be doing our part to hinder the issue. We are aiming to implement this in the Middle School this spring and, assuming all goes accordingly. the Elementary and High Schools next school year.

LIFECYCLE

This past month I had the opportunity to meet with several community leaders regarding the LifeCycle program, including partners from the Indiana Youth Institute, Boys and Girls Club, and the System of Care. We are currently at a standstill on this project, as I have received several different thoughts on transportation needs in our community. I plan to continue analyzing this need; however, I expect my needs assessment to report any transportation needs if necessary.

GROWING TOGETHER

The Growing Together grant will support our Master Gardeners program in improving the garden, replenishing supplies and equipment, and providing nutrition education.

CHANGE TOOL

I have assembled a strong action team and we will have our first meetings this month. We hope to begin data collection by the end of the month.

HOWARD COUNTY FOOD DESERT

An action plan has been developed to address the food insecurity challenge in Howard county. Five subcommittee groups have been developed to address various areas of concern regarding food access. We will reconvene this coming month to evaluate our findings.

Recipe of the Month


BANANA NUT MUFFINS

Ingredients

- . 3 VERF everripe bassass, mashed (about 1 1/3 cup mathed busses, make sure they are almost all the way
- . In cup honey
- . I large egg, at room temperature
- % tablespoon vanilla extract
- % cup alive ail
- 1/4 cop assweetened vanilla almost milk (or milk at choice)
- 1 % cup whole wheat pastry flour"
- I Isaupose baking sada
- I teaspoon cionamos % teaspoon sait
 - Vs cop chopped walnuts, plus 16 cup chopped walnuts for sprinkling on top of muffins

Method

- 1. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F. Line a muffin pan with liners and spray the inside of the liners to prevent sticking.
- 2. In a large bowl, mix together mashed bananas, honey, egg, vanilla, olive oil and milk until well combined. Add in whole wheat pastry flour, baking soda, cinnamon and salt and use a wooden spoon to mix together until the batter is just combined. DO NOT overmix. Fold in 1/2 cup chopped walnuts.
- 3. Divide batter evenly into muffin liners. sprinkle each muffin with chopped walnuts. Bake for 20-25 minutes or until the toothpick comes out with just a few crumbs
- 4. Cool muffins for 5 minutes then remove and transfer to a wire rack to finish cooling. Muffins are best served warm and even better the next day. Makes 12 muffins.
