Dear 4-H Poultry Exhibitor:

As you prepare your poultry project, please read over this letter carefully to ensure that you're meeting all the requirements for the project. Also, be sure to read the Livestock section of the handbook for all terms and conditions as some changes have occurred. Animal Identification:

Enclosed you will find the poultry identification worksheet. This form is due to the Purdue Extension Office by May 16. Ensure that your animals have met the animal ID requirements listed below:

**Animals not enrolled by May 16 cannot be exhibited
at the county or state fair.**

Leg bands can be purchased at the Purdue Extension Office for \$0.50 each. You can either drop by to pick up bands or order them in advance so they're ready when you stop by. You can order them at: <https://tinyurl.com/livestocktagorder2022>.

Lease Agreements:

If you are leasing your animal, 4-H members are required to submit a copy of their Animal Lease Agreement to the Purdue Extension Office by **May 16**. A sample lease agreement is available online <https://tinyurl.com/animalleaseagreement> OR at the Purdue Extension Office.

YQCA Training:

To exhibit beef cattle, meat goats, dairy cattle, dairy goats, poultry, pygmy goats, rabbits, sheep, and swine, 4-H members must be certified through the Youth for the Quality Care of Animals program by July 1, 2022. Trainings can either be completed online or at an in-person training. Instructions were mailed and emailed in early March with details on completing this training and dates for in-person trainings.
