Dear 4-H Swine Exhibitor:

As you prepare your swine project, please read over this letter carefully to ensure that you're meeting all the requirements for the project. Also, be sure to read the Livestock section of the handbook for all terms and conditions. Animal Identification:

Enclosed you will find the animal ID instructions to identify your animals in 4-HOnline. You will also find a worksheet to help you as you enter your animals online. Ensure that your animals have met the animal ID requirements listed below.

Animals not enrolled by May 15 cannot be exhibited at the county or state fair.

* If you plan to take swine to the State Fair, DNA hair samples are required to be turned into the Purdue Extension Office by **May 15** in a specific envelope. Instructions are enclosed. You can find video instructions at <https://extension.purdue.edu/4-H/projects/animal-identification.html>. Envelopes must be obtained from the Purdue Extension Office.

Swine Tagging

You are responsible for tagging your own animals for biosecurity reasons. RFID tags can be purchased at the Purdue Extension Office for \$3. You can either drop by to pick up tags or order them in advance so they're ready when you stop by. You can order them at: <https://tinyurl.com/23VandCoTags>. Please bring your premise ID number when you purchase RFID tags. We are required to send this information to the Indiana Board of Animal Health.

Lease Agreements:

If you are leasing your animal, 4-H members are required to submit a copy of their Animal Lease Agreement to the Purdue Extension Office by **May 15**. A sample lease agreement is available online <https://tinyurl.com/leaseagreementanimal> OR at the Purdue Extension Office.

Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care Training:

New for 2023: to exhibit beef cattle, dairy cattle, dairy goats, meat goats, poultry, pygmy goats, rabbits, sheep, and swine, 4-H members must be certified through the Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care training OR the online Youth for the Quality Care of Animals program (YQCA) by July 1. A letter was sent in late February with more details and training dates. You can find details at <https://extension.purdue.edu/county/vanderburgh/4hresources.html> under Livestock resources.

Premise ID Number:

All 4-H members exhibiting animals at the fair must have a premise ID number for the location where their animals are kept. Registering your premises may be done online, at no charge, and takes only about 5 minutes. If you need a premise ID, visit the Indiana State Board of Animal Health's (BOAH) website: www.in.gov/boah and click on "Premises Registration". You will need this number when entering your animals into 4HOnline and at Tagging Day.

State Fair Information:

Be sure to carefully read the State Fair requirements to ensure that your animal meets the requirements and you understand the fee schedules.
