Welcome! This has to be an exciting time for you as you're getting ready to take your 4-H projects to the Fair. We know you have spent a lot of time getting your project(s) just right, so we are sending you this newsletter/ Survival Guide for the Fair. We know you are very proud of your exhibit. This guide will help you understand what the Fair is all about and what you, as a 4-H member need to know.

Good luck at the Fair this year! Remember, the ribbon you receive is not the reason for being in 4-H. You join 4-H to learn about new and exciting things through your 4-H projects and learn new skills. If you learn something new from your projects, you're a WINNER in 4-H!

Fair-Entry

The Vanderburgh County Fair is right around the corner! Now that you know the projects you plan to exhibit at the fair, we need you to complete one more step in the registration process. The Fair Entry system is designed so that you can enter the exact exhibit or animal you're planning to bring to the fair. For instance, you may have signed up for Photography in 4HOnline. In the Fair Entry system, you will choose the exhibit that you're bringing to the fair, such as a Color Salon Print. This helps us to create labels, judging scorecards, and show bills for the fair. Also, by letting us know which animals you plan to exhibit, livestock superintendents can have an accurate count for setting up animal pens.

Please follow the instructions found <u>here</u> to indicate which exhibits you will be bringing to the fair in person or virtually. Fair Entry will open on June 1, 2023 and close on June 30, 2023. The website to enter is http://vanderburghcountyin.fairentry.com.

Garden Exhibits

4-H members exhibiting produce in the Garden project will be asked if they would like to donate their produce to the Tri-State Food Bank after judging. Exhibits will be on display through Monday or Tuesday and then those projects that wish to be donated will be donated. It is not a requirement to donate produce. Last year, in conjunction with the produce drive, 75 pounds of produce and \$35 was donated to the Tri-State Food Bank!

Project Check-In



Auction Cards

Change for 2023! If you plan to participate in the Livestock Premium Auction, you do not need to enter in advance in Fair Entry. This year, you will have an auction card mailed to you that will be turned in at Livestock check-in that will allow you to participate in the Livestock Premium Auction. You will receive this card in late June or early July. It is the 4-H member's responsibility to return this card in order to participate in the auction. Cards must be turned in at check-in or by noon on Monday, July 24. If you DO NOT plan to participate, please turn in a card with your name and "No Auction" on it. Changes can be made by Thursday, July 27 by 5:00 pm. Please note, the price 4-H member's will receive at the auction is the price at the time the gavel falls minus 5% for livestock improvements and photos. Credit cards will not be accepted from buyers this year. As a reminder, animals that go through the auction are ineligible for State Fair.

Supreme Showmanship

Supreme Showmanship shall include a Level 3 Showman. A Supreme Showman for large animals and small animals shall be awarded.

If an animal is removed from the fair, it will not be able to participate in the auction and will forfeit all ribbons and premiums.






