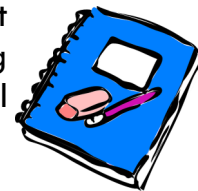

4-H Manuals, Tags, & Supplies

Did you know that each 4-H member can get a manual for most 4-H projects for free? These manuals help provide supplemental learning for the project area and are a great resource for helping to create your exhibit. Please note - not all projects have manuals.

4-H members can pick up 4-H manuals, handbooks, and livestock tags from the Purdue Extension Office. You're welcome to drop in to pick up the items or you can order in advance so they're ready when you stop by. We can also put the items in the drop box if you can't come during business hours. Fair Entry

The Vanderburgh County Fair is right around the corner! Now that you know the projects you plan to exhibit at the fair, we need you to complete one more step in the registration process. The Fair Entry system is designed so that you can enter the exact exhibit or animal you're planning to bring to the fair. For instance, you may have signed up for Photography in 4-H Online. In the Fair Entry system, you will choose the exhibit that you're bringing to the fair, such as a Color Salon Print. This helps us to create labels, judging scorecards, and show bills for the fair. Also, by letting us know which animals you plan to exhibit, livestock superintendents can have an accurate count for setting up animal pens.

Animal Projects

Quality Livestock Care Training

In 2023, Indiana 4-H is implementing a program called Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care that will be replacing the requirement for Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA). The Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care program will be a \$3 in-person training that will be offered several times in 2023. You should have received a letter in late February with more information and training dates ([you can also find it here](#)). The remaining trainings will be held on June 15 at 7:00 pm at the 4-H Center Banquet Hall. Please register in 4-H Online under Events.

To exhibit beef cattle, dairy cattle, dairy goats, meat goats, poultry, pygmy goats, rabbits, sheep, and swine, 4-H members must be certified through the Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care training OR the online Youth for the Quality Care of Animals program (YQCA) by July 1.

Please note - Indiana 4-H will still accept YQCA certification for county and state fair. 4-H members may choose to continue to complete YQCA as it may be required for some livestock shows. Members who wish to complete YQCA will only be allowed to complete the online version. No in person meetings of YQCA will be held. Proof of YQCA completion is due to the Extension Office by July 1.
