## Photography/Communications Example

- A. Reporter for 4-H club.
- B. Took pictures at the club meetings and sent them to the newspaper.
- C. Promoted six Junior Leader Service projects in the Lincoln County Gazette which has a circulation of 3500.

### Animal Science Example

- A. Fed my animals daily.
- B. Tended to my animals daily.

C. Executed the daily feeding, grooming and exercising of my horses and maintained clean stalls. The health of my horses is very important, and these daily care activities keep animals at their best.

### Time Management Example

A. Coordinated my 4-H and school activities.

B. Coordinate my schedule for ten 4-H projects and my school athletic activities.

C. Scheduled events for 4-H, school, FFA, volunteer work, and homework while maintaining an A average in school.

### Citizenship Example

A. Participated in Junior Leader Service Projects

B. Participated in Junior Leader Service projects:Toy Store, canned food drive, and Valentine Day service project.

C. Coached parents in selecting gifts for their children at the annual "Toy Store" for families in need. Each year, the Junio Leaders join efforts with the area churches and other civic groups to help 125 families.
