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4-H Junior Leader Project

Serving as a 4-H Junior Leader is an honor, an opportunity, and a responsibility. 4-H Clubs are most successful when your enthusiasm, energy, and ideas are combined with the experience of your Adult 4-H Leader and your Extension Educator. Junior Leaders is a project which requires careful planning. Your adult leader will supervise your work and be a source of help when you have questions or problems. However, he or she cannot make you a leader -- you must put forth the effort yourself to be an effective leader.

Leadership is the ability of being able to influence the thinking and actions of people. It is the willingness to try a new job and see it through. Leadership does not depend upon the amount of talent you have, but upon what you do with your ability and how you get along with other people. You can be a leader if you have the desire, the willpower, and the urge to develop the qualities and characteristics that make a leader.

Cooperate with your Extension Educators, Adult Leaders, other Junior Leaders, and 4-H members to develop the best program for your club, your county, and also for your greatest personal achievement.

County 4-H Junior Leader Requirements

The following are the requirements you will need to meet in order to complete this project and be eligible to attend the Elkhart County 4-H Junior Leader Completion Activity:

- 1. Be **enrolled in 4-H** for the current year.
- 2. Be enrolled in the County Junior Leader project.
- 3. Be in 7th grade or above during the current school year.
- 4. Be enrolled in and complete one additional 4-H project.
- 5. Complete **7** of the activities in your **4**-H club that are listed in this manual on page **4**. Briefly describe what you did and have the Adult **4**-H Leader of your club initial the activity.
- 6. Attend and actively participate in 24-H Junior Leader meetings. Be sure to sign in at the meetings.
- 7. Actively help with 3 approved County 4-H activities as listed on page 6.
- 8. Work a minimum of 2 fair shifts and 1 project check-in or project check-out shift at the Vermillion County Fair.
- 9. Completely answer the questions in Sections I, II, & III and turn in the completed **4-H Junior Leader** Manual, signed by your Adult **4-H** Club Leader, to the Extension Office by July 1.

NOTE: County 4-H Junior Leaders may receive credit for completing the County 4-H Junior Leader project but may not be eligible to attend the Vermillion County 4-H Junior Leader Completion activity because of missed requirements.
