



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Those who are new to 4-H may be wondering how to get your 4-H Manuals and 4-H Handbook. Below are descriptions of each.

4-H Manuals will be distributed through your primary 4-H Club by the Club Leaders. Most of the clubs try to get manuals distributed at their February or March meetings. You will get last year's manuals and record sheets back at your 4-H Club Meetings as well.

2024 4-H Handbook is available on our website and printed copies will be available in the office very soon! The 4-H Handbook is your guide to the 4-H program, including the project exhibit requirements. If you have specific project questions you will want to refer to your 4-H Handbook before calling anyone. If you cannot find an answer there, feel free to follow up with the Superintendents or the Extension Office.

INDIANA 4-H QUALITY LIVESTOCK CARE PROGRAM

Purdue University Extension has created a new training to take the place of YQCA. This new training, Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care, will be held in person on the dates listed below. The extension office will no longer offer inperson YQCA classes. If you cannot make it to one of these dates AND/OR will be showing at a national show where YQCA is required, you may take the YQCA course ONLINE only. You must show me a copy of your YQCA certificate or send me your YQCA certificate by June 3, 2024 so I can mark you as completed for this year.

To register for the Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care program, please log in to your 4-H Online account, go to the Events tab & register for Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care. (Please do not add anything under the Trainings tab, we will delete it.) It will ask you which date you will be attending. The cost of this class is \$3 and must be paid via cash or check at the door on the day of your chosen training. You will not receive your certificate until this fee is paid. The online YQCA class is \$12. In order to show at county and state fair, you must have a certificate from either YQCA or the Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care program. You will not be able to exhibit your animal(s) at the county and/or state fair without one of these certifications.

All Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care trainings will be held at the **Purdue Extension Warren County Office** in the meeting room. Dates are below:

During this educational workshop, participants rotate individually through a series of stations that test their skills in the areas of swine evaluation, parts identification, and other areas of the swine industry.





Get to Know Your Leaders & Superintendents!

However, if you are participating in a project that has a club, we will add you to that club as a secondary if you do not select it yourself. This is to ensure you receive all of the information that may be sent out for your project. Please do not select a project club if you do not wish to participate in that project. 4-H Manuals are distributed through each of the clubs.

4-H Superintendents work to assist and coordinate the activities for the projects. These great volunteers are available to answer your questions related to your 4-H projects.

VALENTINE'S DAY STEM ACTIVITIES

HEART LAUNCHER

Make a catapult and launch candy hearts! You'll need 10 jumbo craft sticks, 3 rubber bands, a bottle cap, glue, and candy hearts.

Build your catapult by stacking 8 craft sticks on top of one another and secure each end with a rubber band. Wedge the 9th stick between the last and next to last stick perpendicularly. Then place the last stick on top of the stack also perpendicularly & secure the ends of those two sticks with a rubber band. Glue your bottle cap on the opposite end of the top stick. Now you are



ready to launch your candy hearts! Place one in the bottle cap, hold down the catapult with one hand and push down the top part of the lever with the other, then launch!

HEART CUP TOWER CHALLENGE

Can you build a heart shaped tower like this one? All you need are mini red cups and cardboard pieces. Try a larger version for an even bigger challenge!

Start with one cup on the bottom, add a cardboard rectangle to hold the next layer of two cups. Continue this until you have a layer of 5 cups. Then shape the top of your heart with the next two layers of cups.
