




Ski Trip - Are you ready to learn a new skill or brush up your skiing skills? We will be leaving Friday, February, 23 at 6 pm from Williamsport and heading to Jones, Michigan to stay at an Airbnb Friday & Saturday night. Saturday morning, we will head to Swiss Valley for our lesson and ski for the day and evening. Sunday morning, we will travel back to Williamsport and arrive back early afternoon. 4-H scholarships are due January 25th! Scholarships are available to those currently in grades 10-12 and one year post HS graduation. Available scholarships include: 4-H Accomplishment Scholarships (many categories, open to grades 10-12 & one year post high school), 4-H Club Scholarship (open to high school seniors planning to attend Purdue University in the fall, majoring in the College of Agriculture or select majors in the College of Health and Human Sciences), 4-H Senior Year Scholarship (open to high school seniors, Warren County is guaranteed at least 3), and Laurenz Greene Memorial Excellence in 4-H Horticulture Scholarship (open to high school seniors attending Purdue University in the fall, pursuing select majors in the Department of Horticulture and Landscape Architecture).
