

Every year the Warrick County Extension Homemakers Club organizes Homemaker and Open Class exhibiting in The Homemaker Building. Did you know you don't need to be a Homemaker to participate?

We welcome everyone to enter exhibits in a wide variety of divisions - from baking, food preservation, sewing, clothing, needlework, quilting, crafts,

Monday July 17th 4:00pm Exhibits open for public viewing through Fri. July 21st

Saturday July 22rd 9:30-10:30am Pick up exhibits, receive scorecard & ribbon

For a complete list of all the divisions and classes, visit the fair website www.warrickcounty4hcenter.com or contact the Extension office for a copy. Below is some general information.

- 1. Persons belonging to a Warrick County Extension HOMEMAKERS Club are eligible to enter one or more classes under each division, one item per class.
- 2.OPEN CLASS exhibitors will be charged \$2/entry, with a \$20 maximum fee for any number of entries over 10.
- 3. Entries exhibited MUST be made by the exhibitor and all entries must not have been exhibited in previous Warrick County Fairs.
- 4.A Blue, Red, or White ribbon will be awarded to each entry. A Class Champion ribbon will be selected from the blue-ribbon group if there are 2+ blue awards. A Grand Champion Ribbon for the division is selected from the Class Champions. NOTE: In Warrick County NO PREMIUM MONIES WILL BE AWARDED TO EXHIBITORS.
- 5. Entries are to be checked-in on Monday, July 17th, from 8:30 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. in the Homemakers Building.
- 6. Exhibit Tags will be available in advance from the Extension Office, to be completed in advance by exhibitor DIVISION & CLASS must be included. On the back you can include an optional "note to judge" to describe your project or learning experience.
- 7. Exhibits will be judged Monday afternoon, beginning at 12:00 noon. Only Judges and assistants will be allowed in the Homemakers Building during judging. The exhibit will be open for public viewing on Monday, July 17th at 4:00 p.m. in the Homemakers Building.
- 8. Each entry will be judged on its own merit. The judges' decision will be final.

Fresh Vegetable Storage and Cleaning Guide

Consult this guide for specific food safety steps for each type of vegetable.

Remember to refrigerate leftovers immediately after any vegetable has been cut or peeled.

Vegetable	Storage	Rub with fingertips or scrub with a produce brush?	Additional tips
Avocado	Refrigerate after ripening	Scrub	
Broccoli	Refrigerate	Rub	
Carrots	Refrigerate	Scrub	
Chilies/ Other Peppers	Storage in cool place (such as basement or garage) preferred; can be refrigerated	Rub	Keep hands away from face when handling hot peppers.
Corn	Refrigerate	Rub	
Cucumbers	Storage in cool place preferred; can be refrigerated	Scrub	Rinse and scrub well to remove waxy surface. Remaining waxes are safe to eat. Rinse before peeling.
Garlic	Do not refrigerate	Scrub	
Green Beans	Refrigerate	Rub	Rinse and rub before snapping the end of the beans off.
Lettuce	Refrigerate	Rub, moving leaves	Remove outer leaves of non-bagged lettuce. Bagged lettuce labeled "pre-washed"
			does not need to be washed again prior to using.
Onions	Can be refrigerated but not necessary	Scrub	Store in a well-ventilated place so that air can get to onions. Do not freeze whole onions.
Potatoes	Do not refrigerate	Scrub	Remove eyes with a knife or peeler.
Radishes	Refrigerate	Scrub	
Spinach	Refrigerate	Rub, moving leaves	Bagged spinach labeled "pre-washed" does not need to be washed again prior to using.
Squash	Do not refrigerate	Scrub	
Tomatoes	Refrigerate after ripening	Rub	
Zucchini / Summer Squash	Refrigerate after ripening	Scrub	Rinse before peeling.
