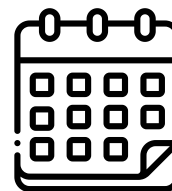

4-H Enrollment Update!

There is still time to enroll in 4-H in 2023! The priority online enrollment window was from October 1st to January 15th, however youth can still enroll in White County 4-H using 4HOnline at <https://v2.4honline.com> until May 15th. Anyone who needs assistance or does not have access to 4HOnline should contact the White County Extension Office at (219) 984-5115 or stop by our office, which is located at 12 N. 25 E. in Reynolds.

A few notes about enrollment:

- For youth who were enrolled in 4-H for the 2021-2022 year, you will use the same family profile that was created last year. If you have forgotten your email or password, you should be able to reset it.
- There is a \$25 enrollment fee per member, with a maximum of \$75 per family. This fee includes the State 4-H program fee and helps to pay for the educational materials provided and events throughout the year. There is no fee for Mini 4-H (grades K-2)
- When completing online enrollment, be sure that the Emergency Contact listed is someone outside of the home that we can contact if the parents cannot be reached.
- **REMINDER!** - For youth who enroll in the Arts & Crafts, Crops, Mini 4-H, and Photography projects: When you enroll in 4HOnline, you will sign up for the general project type. At a date closer to the Fair, you will decide which specific projects you will be exhibiting. We hope this will help to eliminate some confusion at enrollment!
- Youth must be enrolled in White County 4-H by **May 15th** in order to exhibit at the 2023 Fair.
- Make sure the email you have listed in 4-H Online is up-to-date and you are checking it regularly. Many important 4-H updates are sent via email.

We hope you'll think about joining us for all that 4-H has to offer!

Mini 4-H

Mini 4-H is for youth in Kindergarten – 2nd grade and is a great opportunity for youth who are too young to join 4-H to see what the 4-H program is all about. In White County, Mini 4-H members join and participate in a Township 4-H Club, but also will have the chance to participate in some fun Mini 4-H workshops throughout the year. Mini 4-H members can also choose to exhibit projects at the White County 4-H Fair.

Mini 4-H project options include: Animal Poster, Cake Decorating, Collections, Crafts, Creepy Crawlies, Flowers, Foods, Models, Nature/Forestry, Sewing, and Space. Mini 4-H members can also participate in Mini 4-H Animal Showmanship classes for Sheep, Goats, Dairy, Beef, Poultry, Rabbits, and Horses during the Fair (see extension.purdue.edu/white for more details).

Enroll in White County Mini 4-H online at <https://v2.4honline.com> or by visiting the White County Extension Office, at 12 N 25 E, Reynolds, from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday.

2023 White County 4-H Handbook and Manuals

Those who are new to 4-H may be wondering how to get your manuals and 4-H handbook. Below are descriptions of each.

Handbook: The White County 4-H Handbook is now available on our website at <https://purdue.ws/whitehandbook23>. Please read the 2023 requirements before starting any project. The 4-H handbook is your guide to the 4-H program, including the project exhibit requirements. If you have a specific project question, refer to your handbook first. If you cannot find the answer there, follow up with a club leader, project leader, or the extension office.

Manuals: 4-H manuals will be distributed through your primary 4-H club by the club leaders. The leaders have their club lists. Most of the clubs try to get manuals distributed at their February or March meetings. Manual requirements are different for each project and it is best to either check the handbook or check with your 4-H club leaders to find out the specific requirements for your projects. If you did not receive your manuals from your club leader, you can come pick them up at the extension office.

Important Deadlines

- ✓ **May 15th** - Last Day to Enroll in White County 4-H and be eligible to exhibit at the 2023 White County 4-H Fair (4HOnline or Extension Office)
- ✓ **May 15th** - Last Day to Add/Drop Projects in 4HOnline or by contacting Extension Office
- ✓ **May 15th** - Livestock Identification deadline in 4HOnline. All livestock must be identified in 4-H online to exhibit at the White County 4-H Fair AND Indiana State Fair.
- ✓ **July 1st** - All projects that you plan to bring to the 2023 4-H Fair due in online FairEntry program by midnight. This includes both static and livestock projects.
- ✓ **July TBD** - Live Animal (Beef, Cat, Dairy, Dog, Goat, Horse, Poultry, Rabbit, Sheep, Small Animal, Swine) Educational Activities and record sheets (if applicable) due in the Extension Office by 4 PM
- ✓ **July TBD** - Livestock Quality Assurance certification must be completed to exhibit beef, dairy, swine, meat goats, dairy goats, poultry and rabbits. More information on page 7 of the newsletter.

**Please note whether the item is due to the Extension Office or in 4HOnline or FairEntry. Items due to the Extension Office must be received in the Office by the close of business (4 p.m.) on all due dates. Due to the calendar, an alternate due date will be selected for educational activities. Keep an eye on communications for more details. 4HOnline & FairEntry deadlines are midnight on the date listed.*

4-H Camp!



4-H Camp is scheduled this year from June 7-9 at YMCA Camp Tecumseh in Brookston. All 4-H members in grades 3-6 are eligible to attend. Information about 4-H Camp will be sent to all eligible 4-H members when the details have been finalized. We can only send a limited number of campers from White County and selection will be on a first come, first serve basis. 4-H Camp is a great way for youth to learn new things and make new friends from both White County and surrounding counties.

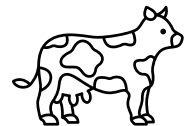
White County Queen Contest

White County Ag Day



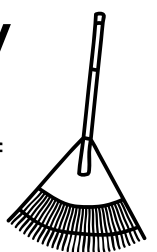

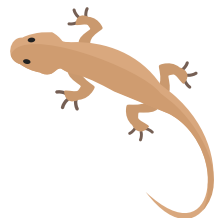

4-H Beef and Dairy Beef Steer Identification

We will be using the 4HOnline system, <https://v2.4honline.com> again this year to identify Beef and Dairy Beef animals. Following weigh-in, youth will be responsible for completing the online Animal ID process for their animals. If you are unable to complete your Animal ID online or need help, please contact the Extension Office for assistance. Any animals that a member may want to exhibit at either the White County Fair or the Indiana State Fair must be identified in 4HOnline by the required deadlines.

- Beef Weigh-in will take place on Saturday, March 4th from 8-10 AM at the Fairgrounds.
- All Beef and Dairy Beef Fat Steers, Beef Heifers and Beef/Dairy Beef Feeder Calves must be identified in 4HOnline no later than May 15th.
- Beef and Dairy Beef animals not tagged at the 4-H Beef Weigh-in in March must contact the Extension Office prior to May 15th to schedule tagging of the animal(s). Tagging and verification by the Dairy Committee must be done by May 15th.
- If you are planning to show at the state fair, you must turn in your DNA hair sample to the Extension Office by May 15 for all Beef animals.
- There is an option in 4HOnline for a Cow-calf pair – please be sure to identify these animals by May 15th. If you plan to also show the calf as a prospect animal, it should be identified as part of the Cow-Calf pair and also in the individual steer or heifer class.
- Beef Steers and Heifers born and bred in White County are eligible for the County Born and Bred classes at the 2023 White County 4-H Beef Show. These animals must be identified by the deadlines and the County Born/Raised box must be checked while identifying the animal online.
- Beef and Dairy Beef members will complete the FairEntry process between June 1st and July 1st to identify the specific animals that will be brought to the White County 4-H Fair. Instructions on this process will be made available at a later date.

Volunteer Information

Anyone who wishes to work with the White County 4-H program needs to be an approved 4-H Volunteer. All new volunteers will need to contact the White County Extension Office for information on how to complete the volunteer approval process. All returning 4-H volunteers will need to re-enroll annually using the 4HOnline system. Volunteers should log into 4HOnline using the login email and password that was used when enrolled in 4HOnline last year. If you have forgotten your email or password or enrolled using a paper form last year, please contact the Extension Office.

REMINDER: All volunteers will be required to complete an online Youth Safety and Reporting Child Abuse training course called Operating Procedures for Programs Involving Minors. This is a policy developed by Purdue to ensure that programs involving minors are planned carefully and include safety as the highest priority. As part of this policy, all Purdue Extension Staff and Volunteers will complete this training course. Once completed, this certification will be good for 1 year. **YOU MUST COMPLETE THE TRAINING BEFORE YOUR ENROLLMENT CAN BE APPROVED.** The training can either be completed in 4HOnline or by coming into the Extension Office, and takes approximately 60 minutes to complete.

Please be sure to enroll as a 4-H Volunteer before you begin working with 4-H youth. This is for the safety of the youth and volunteers alike, and is required. Please contact the White County Extension Office at (219) 984-5115 with any questions or concerns.

Thank you for volunteering with the White County 4-H Program. Without all of you, our program would not be as successful as it is!

Indiana 4-H Livestock Quality Care Program (Formerly YQCA)

Each year, livestock exhibitors are required to complete a quality assurance program in order to show their livestock at the White County and Indiana State Fairs. This program is designed to educate producers (exhibitors) on the care of their animals in order to provide a safe product for consumers. This training is for every 4-Her in grades 3 through 12 who is exhibiting beef, dairy, sheep, swine, goats, rabbits, or poultry at the White County Fair and/or Indiana State Fair. **This is a mandatory program. You must be certified in order to exhibit.**

2023 Update: Purdue Extension and Indiana 4-H have designed a new Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care Program (quality assurance program specifically for Indiana 4-H members). This program will be offered in-person only. It is our hope that this new program will be more interactive and informative for 4-H livestock exhibitors. Thanks to a generous donation from the White County Ag Association, the \$3 in-person program fee has been waived for all White County 4-H Members. However, the option to complete the online YQCA training is still available for \$12 per exhibitor. One reason you may want to complete the online training may be that you are attending an open livestock show may still require the YQCA training. If you are attending any non-4-H livestock show, check the requirements before you go.

(In-Person) Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care Program

1. Register for the event via 4-H Online (v2.4honline.com). Instructions are enclosed. You may only sign up for ONE training event. If you need to change your sign up, call the extension office.
2. Show up to the training, sign in, and stay for the entire length of the training.
3. Receive your training certificate from Molly. This will come within 2 weeks of completion. This certificate will be your proof of completion, more information on this will come during the training event. **Please make sure your email address in 4-H Online is correct.*
4. By July 1st, check your 4-H online profile under the “trainings” tab to make sure your training has been marked complete. If it is not marked complete, call the extension office.
