- Any Whitley County Adult resident or Whitley County Extension Homemaker may participate.
- Registrations made by July 5-\$2.00 per exhibit, maximum \$10.00. After July 5—\$3.00 per exhibit, maximum \$15.00. UNLIMITED ENTRIES - you may enter more than one entry per class. CASH or CHECK payable to: Whitley County Extension **Homemakers**
- All exhibits must be made by the participant within the LAST TWO YEARS.
- You may bring your own props for display. Please label your props.
- Exhibits will be entered at the West Room of the 4-H Center on Wednesday, July 10, between 6:30 -8:30 p.m. and Thursday, July 11, between 8:00 -10:00 a.m. Judging begins at 10:15 a.m. on July 11.
- Exhibits can be picked up on Wednesday, July 17, 6:00 - 8:00 p.m. Anything not picked up, will be available at the Extension Office beginning Monday, July 22.
- Each item will be judged in a closed judging and awarded one ribbon. The judge may award a winner in each division. A People's Choice will be announced on Wednesday, July 17.
- The committee reserves the right to form subclasses as needed and the right to act upon any problem not covered by the rules.
- The committee and Extension Homemakers will be very careful in handling exhibits, but assumes no responsibility for lost or damaged items.

Enter all baked goods and candy in or on a nonreturnable container wrapped in a see-through covering. Cakes and breads should be entered on a cardboard plate. After judging, the baked goods may be sold or donated which depends on county health regulations.

A. Foods

REQUIREMENT: Must include a recipe card.

- Decorated Cakes—scratch or box mix or styrofoam form. (Only the decorating will be judged.)
- Pies—(non-perishable only).
- Cookies-Enter 13 cookies.
- Ouick Bread-Enter one loaf.
- Muffins-Enter 7 muffins.
- 7. Yeast Breads
 - a. Loaf & Rolls-Enter 7 rolls
 - b. Fancy Yeast Products
- Snacks-Enter 2 servings
- Brownies-Enter 10 brownies.

B. Food Preservation

REQUIREMENT: Must include a recipe card. Note:

All food preservation items may be opened for judging. All canned foods must be in canning iars and sealed for judging. For safety, jar rings

should still be on iar.

- Pickles & Relishes—Boiling water bath processed.
- Fruits—Boiling water bath processed
- Tomatoes—boiling water bath processed or pressure canner.
- Vegetables—Processed in pressure canner
- Dried foods
