Dear Potential Purdue Extension Master Gardener Training Participant,

The next local Purdue Extension Master Gardener (EMG) Training will start in Scottsburg on Thursday, August 29, 2024.

The Purdue EMG Basic Training is offered through weekly in-person training sessions at the Train Depot (90 N. Main St., Scottsburg, IN 47170). All sessions are on Thursday evenings, August 29 – December 5, 2024 (no session on November 28), from 6:00 – 9:00 p.m. ET, with the Final Exam on December 12. While schedule changes, sickness, etc. happen, participants are expected to attend all sessions. Educational materials can be picked up before the next week's session if an absence occurs. Participants must pass an open-book final exam with a minimum 70% score to become an EMG Intern. EMG Interns must complete 40 hours of volunteer work to become an active EMG volunteer. To maintain active status, EMG volunteers complete an additional 12 hours of volunteer work and 6 hours of educational training annually.

The Purdue EMG Training fee is \$190/person, which includes the print version of the Purdue EMG Manual. For an additional \$25.00, participants will also receive the digital version of the manual. If two people from the same household want to share the print version of the Purdue EMG Manual, the total fee is \$290.00.

Enclosed in this packet is the Purdue Publication HO-184 that explains more about the EMG Training. To begin the EMG Training registration process, participants complete the enclosed EMG-1 form and submit it to the Extension office. While at the Extension office, a staff member must view a government issued photo ID. After reviewing the application, an Extension staff member will perform a required background check. When at least 10 EMG-1 forms are submitted by Thursday, August 1, 2024, an email with the link to register and pay the training fee online through the Purdue Education Store via Cvent will be sent.

Provisions of the Agreement to Participate in the Purdue Extension Master Gardener Program

Please read the statements below. By signing this form, you agree to all the statements below.

- Use of Title. I understand that the title "Purdue Extension Master Gardener" is to be used exclusively in the Purdue EMG Program. Purdue EMGs are expected to identify themselves as such only when engaged in unpaid public service approved by Purdue Extension. Appearing in a commercial activity, endorsing commercial products, or implying Purdue University endorsement of any product or place of business are inappropriate and violate the policies of the Purdue EMG Program.
- Understanding Policies. I have read the Purdue EMG Program Policy Guide (www.hort.purdue.edu/mg) and agree to follow all policies regarding participation in the program.
- Age Certification. I am 18 years or older.
- **Registry Checks.** I consent to annual registry checks via the Dru Sjodin National Sex Offender Registry and Indiana Sex Offender Registry as explained in the Purdue EMG Program Policy Guide.
- Identity Verification. I agree to provide evidence of a government-issued photo ID verifying my identity.
- Behavioral Expectations. I agree to abide by the adult behavioral expectations for Purdue EMGs explained in the Purdue EMG Program Policy Guide.
- **Pest Recommendations.** I agree to make recommendations to the public according to the Purdue EMG pest information policy outlined in the Purdue EMG Program Policy Guide.
- Liability Release. I understand that participating in the Purdue EMG Program can involve certain risks to me. I accept those risks. I hereby discharge Purdue University, the Trustees of Purdue University, the county commissioners, the Purdue Extension county office, and each of their trustees, officers, appointees, agents, employees, and volunteers ("Released Parties") from all claims that I might have for any injury or harm including death, arising out of my participation in any activity related to the Purdue EMG Program, even if such injury or harm is caused by the negligence or fault of any of the Released Parties. I agree to report volunteer activity and educational training hours to the EMG county coordinator at least once per year using a reporting method approved by the EMG county coordinator.
- County Coordinator. I understand that the Purdue Extension educator serving as the Master Gardener county coordinator for the county where I volunteer as a Purdue EMG is the coordinator and advisor for the Purdue EMG Program in that county and for my involvement in the program.
- Notification of Changes. I will contact the Purdue EMG county coordinator or Purdue EMG state coordinator if changes in my life occur that cause me to be ineligible to serve as a Purdue EMG volunteer.

The Purdue Master Gardener Program makes the latest information about gardening and home horticulture available to people like you — individuals with a deep interest in gardening.

Purdue Master Gardener Volunteers help others grow by sharing what they learn and by leading educational gardening activities in their communities.

The Master Gardener Program model began in 1972 in Seattle, Washington, in response to public demand for home gardening information. Indiana's program started in 1978 with four counties: Allen, Lake, Marion, and Vanderburgh. Currently, many Indiana counties offer the Purdue Master Gardener Program.



Gain Gardening Knowledge and Skills

As part of the program, you'll attend 12 to 18 weeks of classes. Each class lasts three to four hours.

You'll learn more about:

- Plant science
- Plant nutrition
- Soil science
- Pest identification, diagnosis, and control for:
 - Animals
 - Insects
 - Plant Diseases
 - Weeds
- Pesticide safety and pesticide alternatives
- Care of specific plant types:
- Home lawns
- Herbaceous ornamentals
- Vegetables
- Woody ornamentals
- In addition, you may learn about:
 - Home fruit production
 - Indoor gardening
 - Landscape design
 - Yard waste management

Get Trained, Have Fun, and Get Certified

After the training classes, you will take an exam. If you score 70 percent or higher, you will become a Master Gardener Intern.

To be certified a Master Gardener, you must also volunteer for at least 35 hours within two years of completing training. To remain active, Purdue Master Gardeners must continue to volunteer at least 12 hours a year and earn six hours of approved training each year.
