Giving Childcare Providers the Tools for Success

Purdue Extension gives childcare providers necessary tools to prepare children for kindergarten. Its professional-development programs address social and emotional skill-building, STEM support, cultural competence, and ties between physical activity and brain development. In Indiana, 450 childcare providers receive monthly training, with more than 80% using these new skills in their classrooms. "The training was extremely helpful in advancing our efforts in becoming more confident and effective in family engagement practices," says Judy Ford, Program Director of Caring Heart, Open Arms Childcare and Development Ministry in Hobart, Ind.
