### Teenagers Lead the Class

Elementary students across Indiana are learning fun lessons in computer coding, healthy living, leadership and more — and the instructors are teenagers.

They're part of the burgeoning Teens as Teachers program, facilitated by Indiana 4-H Youth Development and open to high school freshmen through seniors. Participants learn to teach a subject and receive materials to conduct their own classes, as Elizabeth Tedder did for a 10-week program in Bartholomew County that included DNA modeling using pipe cleaners. How did the students enjoy it?
