




## **Networking Reminders**






# Inclusive Leadership

## Sections 5 & 13: Communication & Participation Requirements


## **Full Participation Includes:**

- On-time and complete attendance at all required sessions and activities
- Completion of all required assignments and independent work
- Absences for extenuating circumstances must be excused in advance
- Excessive unexcused absences or incomplete sessions may lead to dismissal (Missing 20 hours or 4 days)

## Appropriate Gender Interactions in the United States

- May be more informal
- Physical contact is not permitted without the other person's express permission
- Keep all interactions with Institute and campus faculty, staff, students, and each other on a professional level
- It is inappropriate to hug, kiss, or engage in unnecessary physical contact with another person <u>without their express</u> <u>permission</u>





## Gender Interactions and Sexual Respect

- **Sexual Harassment:** Making sexual advances toward someone from whom you do not have consent (permission), or creating an intimidating, hostile, or offensive environment. This includes:
  - Sexual invitations, comments, or jokes about a person
  - Unnecessary touching of another person's body without their consent
  - Repeatedly pursuing someone who is not interested
  - Sexual assault, including rape
  - Sexual contact with anyone under 18
- Sexual harassment can occur regardless of gender





# It is **not** about your intent.

It is about how your actions are received by the other person.





# Travel Policy Within the United States

- Fellows assume all risks and expenses
- No travel in the first or last weeks of Institutes or PDEs or during the Summit
- 350-mile maximum radius within the U.S. only
- Approved travel form required
- Schedule networking virtual meetings
- Fellows assume all risks and expenses not covered by the Fellowship







# **Drug and Alcohol Policy**

### All Fellows must

- Comply with U.S. laws and all Institute policies
- Represent the Fellowship in a positive and professional way
- Not sell, use, or possess any drugs that are illegal under U.S. or local law
- Act responsibly with regard to their own safety and participation in the Fellowship, as well as that of others



If Fellows do not comply, they could be sent home.





## Institute Policies

- Consumption and/or Possession of Alcohol is prohibited in University Residence Halls
- Smoking including the use of e-cigarettes or personal vaporizing instruments are prohibited in University Residence Halls and call University buildings







# Warning & Dismissal Procedures

## **First Minor Infraction**

Verbal warning accompanied by an email to IREX

## **Second Minor Infraction**

**Written warning** signed by the Fellow

Multiple Minor or Single Major Infraction

**Recommendation for revocation** of an individual's Fellowship





# Fellow Health & Self Care



## Accident and Sickness Program for Exchanges (ASPE)

## **ASPE Covers:**

- Medical Costs incurred due to an accident, sudden illness, or an unexpected issue/emergency related to a preexisting condition
- **Prenatal visits** for pregnant Fellows
- Mental Health Support:
  - ASPE Assist Hotline: 1-833-963-1269
     ASPEsupport@anvilgroup.com

## **ASPE Does NOT Cover:**

- Primary care and routine health examinations
- Required fees (also known as co-payments) for doctor's visits, urgent care centers, hospital visits, or prescription medicines
- Medical costs for injuries incurred during a perilous activity (skateboarding, skydiving, etc.)



# Using ASPE

#### **Before Seeing a Doctor**

- Notify Institute Staff Lonni Kucik, 765-412-6464, <a href="mailto:lkucik@purdue.edu">lkucik@purdue.edu</a>
- Select a doctor in the "First Health International Network"
- Call the office to provide ASPE policy information and confirm coverage
- Make the appointment
- Notify Seven Corners and seek pre-certification as needed

#### At the Doctor's Office

- Bring Passport and ASPE card
- Check-in and complete paperwork and provide your ASPE card
  - o If there are issues with coverage, call Seven Corners (800) 461-0430
- Obtain all prescriptions and discharge paperwork before leaving
- Pay any outstanding co-payments before leaving
  - \$25 per office/telehealth visit
  - \$75 per Emergency Room (ER) visit or Urgent Care
- Note: Any recommended outpatient procedures or surgeries must be pre-certified. Approved outpatient services are covered on a reimbursement basis.





# Using ASPE (continued)

## After your visit

- Fill prescriptions at a local pharmacy and follow all care instructions
- File for reimbursement, if necessary
  - Save all receipts, bills, invoices, and treatment documentation in case reimbursement is needed
    - Important: Review the ASPE Benefits Guide for information that must be included if you seek reimbursement for any costs you pay up front
  - Complete required forms from <u>www.sevencorners.com/about/gov/usdos/forms</u>
    - Medical Claim Form
    - Prescription Reimbursement Form
    - Payment Authorization Form
  - Approved reimbursement(s) will be issued by check or wire transfer
    - \* Note: Not all expenses can be reimbursed
