
# **MINI GOAT**





### **FIRST YEAR**

### Activities:

- You may attend a Dairy Goat or Meat Goat Meeting
- You may make a Dairy Goat or Meat Goat Farm visit
- Answer the questions in Activity 1. You may need to get help. Goat members are good helpers or you could use the Goat Resource Handbook from Ohio State University Extension or other references.
- Make a collage or poster about Dairy Goats or Meat Goats or Goat products. You can use pictures from magazines or draw your own. Your poster should be 14" high and 22" wide. Cover your poster on the front with clean plastic stretched very smooth. This will protect it and keep it clean.

### Exhibit:

- Bring your poster to the County Fair. Attach the completed Page 2 to the poster back. Make sure your name, club and grade are on the front side of your poster in lower right hand corner.
- Show a goat at the fair. Find someone or ask the goat committee or contact the Extension Office by May 15, to find you someone that shows goats at the Allen County Fair. Go to their farm and learn how to feed, groom, and show a goat. Then show their goat in the mini class at the County Fair. You DO NOT bring your own goat. Read the rules in the rule book. If you are showing a live goat at the Fair, please turn in the last page to the Extension Office by June 30, 2021.

#### **SECOND AND THIRD YEAR**

#### Activities:

- You must attend at least one Dairy Goat or Meat Goat Workshop.
- Make a visit to a Farm.
- Make a notebook about your farm visit. You can take pictures or cut pictures from Goat magazines to illustrate your notebook.
- Answer all questions in Activity 1 and 2. Your farm visit will help you. Put these pages in your farm visit notebook.

#### Exhibit:

- Or Bring your notebook to the Fair. Be sure to label it with your name, club and grade.
- Show a goat at the fair. Find someone or ask the goat committee or contact the Extension Office by May 15 to find you someone that shows goats at the Allen County Fair. Go to their farm and learn how to feed, groom, and show a goat. Then show their goat in the mini class at the County Fair. You DO NOT bring your own goat. Read the rules in the rule book. If you are showing a live goat at the Fair, please turn in the last page to the Extension Office by June 30, 2021.
