4-H Reminders

- 4-H Enrollment is **NOT COMPLETE** until the \$20 Program Fee has been paid.
- Add or Drop dates for 4-H projects is May 15th.
- Seniors: Be sure to verify your years in 4-H are correct. If you believe it is incorrect, it is your responsibility to contact the Extension Office to make the necessary changes.
- If showing livestock animals, please turn to pages 3-6 for further information.



Livestock Showing Amounts

There are new guidelines for the number of animals each 4-H member may exhibit at the 2020 Bartholomew County 4-H Fair. It is important to point out that this is **NOT** a limit on the number of animals that you may enroll in 4hOnline, it is just the maximum number that may be exhibited at the Bartholomew County Fair.

Each 4-H member may exhibit the following:

*Beef—maximum of 5 (beef steers, heifers, dairy steers, starter calves)

Dairy—maximum of 5 heifers and 3 cows

Goat-maximum of 10 goats, limit of 2 goats per class

Poultry—may have 2 entries per class, maximum of 16 birds

Rabbit—2 rabbits per class, 1 meat pen, and 1 each of the following: roaster, stewer, & fryer; maximum of 20 rabbits

Sheep—maximum of 10 sheep

*Swine—maximum of 5 hogs

*New changes for 2020

🌺 Beginner Livestock Meetings

Every 4-H member who is enrolled or plans to enroll in a 4-H livestock project for the very first time is REQUIRED to attend one of two Beginner Livestock Exhibitor meetings. This meeting is for any 1^{st} year member who intends to show livestock, or for any previous year member who plans to show livestock for the first time in their 4-H career. Members who show or have previously shown livestock animals (Beef, Dairy, Goats, Poultry, Rabbit, Sheep, Swine) DO NOT need to attend one of the two meetings.

These meetings will be held on Monday, February 24th and Thursday, April 9th at 6:30 PM at the Purdue Extension Office (783 S Marr Rd). Meetings will have important information about identification of animals, deadlines, health, and selection of livestock.

🍀 Changes to the Livestock Auction

In recent years it has become increasingly difficult for our auction committee to find buyers willing to accept 4-H livestock animals of all species. These difficulties, in addition to the announcement regarding the use of ractopamine (Paylean) in market hogs (see page 4), has resulted in the need to bring about changes to the Bartholomew County 4-H Fair Livestock Auction. These changes include:

- Auction will be a premium only auction.
- To participate in the auction, 4-H members must retain one animal on the fairgrounds to walk through the auction ring.
- 4-H members and their families will be responsible for the removal of all animals from the Fairgrounds. It will be your responsibility to transport or arrange transportation of your animals to market or packer.

While we know this may cause some concern, our hope is that by announcing this change in February families will have adequate time to prepare. More information will be available in the coming months.



Use of Ractopamine (Paylean) in Market Hogs

In response to the anticipated rising demand for US pork products due to the impact African Swine Fever has had on global pork supply, JBS USA (Swift and Swift Premium) and Tyson Foods will prohibit the use of ractopamine (Paylean) in market hogs the company buys beginning in February 2020. Although ractopamine is an FDA-approved feed ingredient that helps increase the amount of lean meat in hogs, some countries such as China, prohibit the import of pork from hogs that have been fed the product. This policy change will allow these companies to better position themselves to fill increased export demand for pork. Producers had until February 4, 2020, to meet the new requirement. These companies have said they plan to work with pork producers over the next several months to begin the process of testing hogs to ensure they are ractopamine-free, ensuring compliance.

What does this mean for 4-H animals? Counties that market swine to these pork processors will also have to comply with these new requirements. It's predicted that the marketing of 4-H animals may become more difficult, as ractopamine is widely utilized in show pig feeds. Indiana 4-H is not banning the use of ractopamine in 4-H swine, but is bringing awareness that the use of this feed additive will limit hog processing to more local markets and/or other smaller processors. As always, it is important to use products responsibly under the proper label use. We will continue to follow up to keep the industry at the forefront of our educational efforts.

Each species will receive a letter that will include information about ID days, an ID worksheet, location form, and instructions on how to complete the livestock enrollment at in.4honline.com. All livestock enrollment will be completed online, with the exception of Rabbit and Poultry. Attending the livestock ID date **DOES NOT** enroll your livestock. Enrollment of livestock must be completed at in.4honline.com by the following dates:

April 1st— Beef & Dairy Beef Steers

May 15th— Starter Calves, Heifers, Sheep, Goat, Horse & Pony, Swine

Enrollment MUST be done online *NO LATER* than 12 midnight of the listed date.

Poultry and rabbit enrollment papers must be submitted to the Extension Office by 4:30 p.m. Friday, June 5th.

If you have any questions, please call the office at 812-379-1665. Failure to complete the livestock enrollment process by the above deadlines may result in your 4-H member not being permitted to exhibit at the Bartholomew County Fair and/or the Indiana State Fair.

YOUTH FRE QUALITY CARE SAMMALS

This educational program will allow 4-H members to learn about the importance of animal-wellbeing, quality assurance practices, and their part in the food production system. All 4-H members enrolled in Beef, Dairy, Dairy Starter Calves, Dairy Goats, Meat Goats, Poultry, Rabbits, Sheep, and Swine must complete the YQCA program annually in order to exhibit livestock at the Bartholomew County 4-H Fair and/or the Indiana State Fair.

Bartholomew County 4-H members are asked to complete YQCA by May 15, 2020. YQCA can be completed via the online module or by attending an in-person training. To sign up for in-person training, or to take the online certification training, head to www.yqca.org. Click "sign in/register" at the top right corner and select sign in with 4HOnline. DO NOT sign in as an independent user. (See correct login selection below.) Once you have completed the training, you should print your certification. See below for instructions on printing certificate. You must show proof of completion at packet pick-up.

To print your certificate: Once completed, log in to the YQCA website and select the child's name. Select the training that was completed. There should be a small gold star towards the top. Click on the box with the gold star. A page will populate with options for printing the YQCA certificate.

Register for 4-H/Pay Program Fee

Go to in.4honline.com and sign up for 4-H. 4-H program fees should be paid in a timely manner (within two weeks of enrollment). Those who have not paid by the May 15th deadline will be unable to register animals in 4hOnline & FairEntry, and therefore unable to exhibit at the county fair.

Attend necessary meeting for new livestock exhibitors

New livestock exhibitors need to make arrangements to attend one of the two Beginner Livestock Meetings– February 24th or April 9th

Add your animals to the 4hOnline system

Animal information should be double checked after entry. Information deadline dates:

Beef: Saturday, February 15; 9:00-10:30 AM, Livestock Barn Starter Calf: Wednesday, April 8; 6:00-7:30 PM, Livestock Barn Sheep: Wednesday, May 6, 6:00-7:30 PM, Little Hands Goats: Thursday, May 7, 6:00-7:30 PM, Little Hands

YQCA

Verify when your certification expires. You must show valid proof of certification at Livestock Packet Pick up. If it is NOT valid through the 2020 Bartholomew County 4-H Fair, you may elect to recertify online or in a instructor led class. See page 5 for more information about YQCA.

Pen Request Form

Pen Request forms will be mailed out to livestock members after the May 15th deadline has occurred. The Pen Request Form will need to be returned to the Extension Office by June 5, 2020, no later than 4:30 PM.

State Fair Entry

If you intend on showing at the Indiana State Fair, you will need to register your animals through the Indiana State Fair website. The earlier you enroll, the cheaper the entry fees. Deadline for enrollment is July 1. DNA samples need to be turned in to the Extension Office no later than April 1st for steers or May 15th forheifers, swine, sheep, and goats. *Please note: The Extension Office does not have access to any State Fair entry records. All queries or changes will need to be made through the website or by contacting the Indiana State Fair.*


