

4-H members in 3rd-12th grade are welcome to walk in the Festival of Lights Parade, December 1st. More information to come on meeting location and time.




# STAY CONNECTED!





## GLOBAL GATEWAY EXPERIENCE

AGRICULTURE. CITIZENSHIP. GROWTH







Do you have an interest in learning about Citizenship and global hunger issues? There is an opportunity for Bartholomew County 4-H members (grades 7-12) to get involved and learn more by attending the Global Gateway Experience at the Heifer Ranch in Perryville, Arkansas, April 11-15, 2019 (Thursday evening – Monday evening).

The Global Gateway Experience includes a Global Village in which youth will see recreated urban slums, bamboo huts, shanties, refugee camps, and more. The Heifer Ranch creates an experience in which nothing shelter, food, water or cooking fuel - can be taken for granted. Participants will understand global hunger through a number of exercises and prepare a meal with limited resources while staying in the Global Village.

The Bartholomew County 4-H Council will cover the \$185 cost of attending this trip. Bartholomew County 4-H members attending this trip will be responsible for a \$25 deposit, which will be returned to the 4-H member to use for meals while traveling. This deposit is non-refundable if you choose to not attend the trip if selected. Meals on the trip to/from Arkansas will be the responsibility of the

4-H member. Transportation by charter bus will be provided and is sponsored by Farm Credit Mid-America and Indiana 4-H Youth Development. Youth must submit an application as this trip is limited. Bartholomew County can take a team of 4 youth and 1 adult on this trip. Applications are available from the Bartholomew County Extension Office and are due by noon on Thursday, November 15<sup>th</sup>.





This educational program will allow 4-H members to learn about the importance of animal-wellbeing, quality assurance practices, and their part in the food production system. All 4-H members enrolled in Beef, Dairy, Dairy Starter Calves, Dairy Goats, Meat Goats, Poultry, Rabbits, Sheep, and Swine must complete the YQCA program annually in order to exhibit livestock at the Bartholomew County 4-H Fair and/or the Indiana State Fair.

Bartholomew County 4-H members are asked to complete YQCA by May 15, 2019. YQCA can be completed via the online module or by attending an in-person training. To sign up for in-person training, or to take the online certification training, head to www.yqca.org. Click "sign in/register" at the top right corner and select sign in with 4HOnline. DO NOT sign in as an independent user. (See correct login selection below.) Once you have completed the training, you should print your certification. Select the training that was completed. There should be a small star towards the top. It will give you the option to print. You must show proof of completion at packet pick-up.

#### Enrolling in 4HOnline as a Youth Member: Quick Guide

- 1. Go to the Indiana 4-H online page located at https://in.4honline.com <u>using Google Chrome or Mozilla Firefox</u>. Please note that other browsers including those on mobile devices are not recommended and may cause the system to lock up.
- 2. Log in using your family user ID (email) and password. If you have forgotten your password, you can reset it yourself by selecting the 'I forgot my password' option and entering your family email. Please DO NOT create a new profile if you know you have an existing one.
- 3. Once logged in, click the orange, 'Continue to Family' button. From this new screen, select the member you want to re-enroll and select 'edit'. Scroll to the bottom of the page and select 'Enroll for 2018-2019.'
- 4. Review and make any adjustments/changes to the following items. You will also find pages to review, as well as electronically sign the Youth Behavioral Expectation forms. Please read each of these carefully.
  - Personal Information (including CONTACT INFORMATION)
  - Club Enrollment (Only select clubs that member will participate in this year)
  - Project Enrollment (Only *select* projects that member will complete this year & delete those projects not taking from last year)
- 5. An individual invoice is created for each member. <u>Enrollment is not complete until the enrollment is submitted, payment is received, AND approved by the county Extension Office.</u> Click continue to review the invoice and select a payment option. Payment can be made via debit/credit card *(online)* or a check *(brought or mailed to the Extension Office)*
- 6. You will receive a separate email when your enrollment is approved by the county office. Please watch these emails closely for additional information following your enrollment process.


