NEW Livestock Check-In Times in 2019

In an effort to streamline the livestock check-in process for all species, changes have been made to the assigned arrival and check-in times. 4-H members should plan to bring their livestock to the Bartholomew County Fair between 7—11 a.m. on the following dates:

Friday, July 5th Goats
Saturday, July 6th Swine

Monday, July 8th Sheep, Beef, Starter Calf, & Dairy Steers

More information will be included in the Livestock Packets that will be distributed on July 2nd.

Project Check In


Project Check In for 4-H Exhibits (excluding Pre 4-H, crops, beekeeping, flowers, and garden) is July 1st from 3:30—6:30 PM in the Community Building. No early judging will be allowed, and doors will not open until 3:30 PM. If you are not able to make project check in and judging, you will need to arrange for a family member, friend, club leader, or fellow 4 -H'er to take your project for you.

The Extension Office will not accept projects at the office, and will not be responsible for taking projects to judging events.

Project Pick Up

4-H projects **MUST** be picked up from the Community Building on July 14th from 12:00 PM—3:00 PM or July 15th from 11:00 AM—1:00 PM. **NO projects will be brought back to the Extension Office.**





Fair Entry

Letters with instructions for Fair Entry have been mailed out. Please read through the letter and instructions carefully. Fair Entry is an important part of the judging process and MUST be completed by June 21st. The Extension Office is available to assist with Fair Entry during normal business hours. Again, do not wait until the last minute.

June Judging

4-Her's who are taking Creative Writing, Verbal Communications, Performing Arts, Consumer Clothing, and Fashion Revue, will find important information regarding your projects below. Be sure to check the 2019 Bartholomew County 4-H Family Handbook for further information or clarification on your particular project.

Creative Writing: All notebooks must be turned in to the Extension Office no later than 4:30 PM on Friday, June 7th.

Performing Arts: Judging will be from 12:30 PM—3:00 PM, and take place at Grace Lutheran Church, 3201 Central Ave, Columbus, IN 47203 On June 11th.

Verbal Communications: Judging will begin at 5:00 PM at the Extension Office on June 11th. The event will begin following registration.

Consumer Clothing: Takes place on Tuesday, June 18th at 12:00 PM and will be held at St. Peters Lutheran School. Registration will begin 30 minutes prior to the event. Remember you are to model your purchased garment(s) and participate in judge interviews after modeling. Consumer Clothing members will participate in the Public Revue at 7:00 PM.

Fashion Revue: June 18th at St. Peter's Lutheran School, Fashion Revue will begin after Consumer Clothing is finished with judging, or no earlier than 1:00 PM. Registration will begin at 12:45 PM. That evening at 7:00 PM the public Fashion Revue showing will take place. Remember, garments modeled must have been made by 4-H member, and must be garment(s) that when put together make a complete look— such as a dress, pant suit, skirt and blouse.

Beginner Livestock

If you are new to 4-H this year and showing a livestock animal, or are a 4-H member showing livestock for the first time and did not attend one of the two Beginner Livestock Information Meetings, you MUST schedule a time to watch the Beginner Livestock Video at the Extension Office by June 15th in order to show livestock.

Livestock Packet Pick Up

Packet Pick up is July 2nd from 3:00—6:00 PM in the Pavilion. In order to collect your packet, you must show proof of completing the YQCA program (excludes Horse & Pony). Included in your packet will be information on filling out livestock entry tickets, show attire, pen signs, and a complimentary parking pass.

All packets must be picked up within the 3 hour window. If not, you will forfeit your complimentary parking pass. Additional parking passes will be available for purchase during packet pick up at a reduced rate of \$15.

Packets do not have to be picked up by the actual 4-H member. You may send a friend or family member to pick up your packet. Packets WILL NOT be passed out before the scheduled time.

YQCA

Bartholomew County 4-H members were asked to complete YQCA by May 15, 2019. YQCA can be completed via the online module. To take the online certification training, head to www.yqca.org. Click "sign in/register" at the top right corner and select sign in with 4HOnline. DO NOT sign in as an independent user. (See correct login selection below.) Once you have completed the training, you should print your certification. Select the training that was completed. There should be a small star towards the top. It will give you the option to print. You must show proof of completion at packet pick-up.





Livestock Showing Amounts

As previously announced, there are new guidelines for the number of animals each 4-H member may exhibit at the 2019 Bartholomew County 4-H Fair. It is important to point out that this is **NOT** a limit on the number of animals that you may enroll in 4hOnline, it is just the maximum number that may be exhibited at the Bartholomew County Fair. Only animals that will be exhibited to the Bartholomew Co. Fair should be registered in Fair Entry.

Each 4-H member may exhibit the following:

Beef—maximum of 4 beef animals per gender (i.e. 4 beef steers, 4 heifers, 4 dairy steers, 4 starter calves)

Dairy—maximum of 5 heifers and 3 cows

Goat—maximum of 10 goats, limit of 2 goats per class

Poultry—may have 2 entries per class, maximum of 16 birds

Rabbit—2 rabbits per class, 1 meat pen, and 1 each of the following: roaster, stewer, & fryer; maximum of 20 rabbits

Sheep—maximum of 10 sheep

Swine—maximum of 4 hogs

4-H Watermelon Relay Friday, July 5 at 8:00 PM—Horse Arena



Watch your favorite 4-H'er race against the clock with a greased watermelon! Admission is free, but donations to the Bartholomew County 4-H Program are greatly appreciated.

Below are the rules for the Bartholomew County fair Watermelon Relay. Please be aware that the rules may change due to time constraints and the number of teams participating. The rules will be told 30 minutes prior to the race, so please plan accordingly to have all teams and members gathered for rule announcements.

In order to participate in the relay, you MUST be in 4-H, have registered with the Extension office, and paid the \$5.00 entry fee by the stated deadline.

- Shoes must be worn at all times.
- You must stay in contact with the watermelon at all times.
- If the watermelon is broken, you must try to carry the pieces with you. What is left must be handed off to the next leg of the relay team.
- If an obstacle is not completed as explained, you will be told to start the obstacle over by the field judge.
- All decisions by the field judge are final.
- Not completing obstacles as explained may result in your team being disqualified.
- Winners will be decided by the team's total time it takes to complete the race.
- There will be a course demonstration before the first race. All teams need to be present so they know what is expected of them during the race.
- All team members will be greased with their watermelon before each race
- There are five people to a team. Each member of the team must run in each relay race.
- Start at designated starting line. Time ends when last person crosses starting line.
