4-Her's who are taking Creative Writing, Verbal Communication, Performing Arts, Consumer
Clothing, and Fashion Revue, below you will find important information regarding your projects.
Be sure to check the 2017 Bartholomew County
4-H Family Handbook for further information or clarification on your particular project.

**Creative Writing:** All notebooks must be turned in no later than 4:30 PM to the Extension Office on Friday, June 9.

Performing Arts: Judging will begin at 12:30 PM— 3PM, and take place at Grace Lutheran Church, 3201 Central Ave, Columbus IN 47203 on June 13. You will receive information after the May 15th deadline regarding performing time slots.

Verbal Communications: Judging will begin at 5:00 pm in the Family Arts Building at the Bartholomew County Fairgrounds on June 13. Registration will start before event.

Consumer Clothing: Takes place at 12:00 PM, Tuesday, June 20 in Fair Oaks Mall. Registration will begin 30 minutes prior to the event. Remember you are to model your purchased garment(s) and participate in judge interviews after modeling. Consumer clothing members will participate in the Public Revue at 7 PM.

Fashion Revue: June 20, at Fair Oaks Mall, Fashion Revue will begin after Consumer Clothing is finished with Judging, or no earlier than 1 PM. Registration will begin at 12:45 PM. That evening, 7 PM, Fashion Revue Public showing will take place. Remember, garments modeled must have been made by 4-H member, and must be garment(s) that when put together make a complete look— such as dress, pant suit, skirt and blouse.

## **Livestock Information**

Beef, Dairy, Goats, Poultry, Rabbits, Sheep, Swine

#### **Beginner Livestock**

If you are new to 4-H this year and showing a livestock animal, OR are a 4-H member showing a NEW livestock animal this year and did not attend the Beginner Livestock Information Meetings in February, you must schedule a time to watch the Beginner Livestock Video at the Extension Office by **JUNE 1** in order to show livestock.

#### Livestock Information Meeting(s) April 2, 18

As a 4-H'er who is showing livestock with no animal changes, you were required to attend a mandatory informational meeting in April. If you were unable to attend one of the two meetings, there is an alternative assignment that will need to be done for each type of animal you intend on showing. These worksheets will need to be completed and signed by a parent/guardian and returned to the Extension Office by **JUNE 1.** 

#### **Member Consent**

Please note when entering in your livestock animals information, the member's consent check box at the bottom. This box must be checked in order for the online animal enrollment to be complete. Due to this consent, the Extension Office is not able to enter your livestock information for you. Animals must be entered through the family login and consent must be given when all information is input.

#### **PQA-Pork Quality Assurance**

Make sure to get your certification by **June**1 if you plan on showing swine at the 2017
Fair. Instructions are listed below for logging on to the www.pork.org website.
The Purdue Extension Office is open
Monday—Friday; 8-4:30 if you have questions or are needing to use a computer. The Extension Office cannot help with problems on the website, or log in issues, so please try and finish your certification sooner rather than later.

- 1. Go to www.pork.org
- 2. Click "Certification" on top left hand side.
- 3. Under Youth PQA Plus, click on Advisor/Trainer Login
- 4. If you know your Username and Password you may login, if you do not then click on the option to the right in the "Need Help" section that best identifies your needs.
- Once logged in, you may proceed to take the certification for 2017/2018. It is advised to print off certificate once completed.

If you did not receive or further information is needed, please contact the Extension Office. All livestock enrollment will be completed online, with the exception of Rabbit and Poultry. Poultry and Rabbit enrollment papers must be submitted to the Extension Office by 4:30 p.m. Friday, June 9<sup>th</sup>.



If you have any questions, please give the office a call at 812-379-1665. Failure to complete the livestock enrollment process by the deadlines may result in your 4-H member not being permitted to exhibit at the Bartholomew County Fair and/or the Indiana State Fair.
