PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

4-H members should use their creativity and computer skills to develop artistic projects on the computer. Any computer and computer program may be used.

EXHIBIT

Exhibits may be displayed on a poster or in a notebook. Include the title, "Computer Arts", and your completed project on the poster or in the notebook. Attach your completed record sheet to the back of your poster or place it in the notebook.

Beginner (grades 3-5): Design 2 of the following in any combination (may be 2 of the same):

- Banner
- Certificate
- Event Ticket
- Greeting Card

Intermediate (grades 6-8): Design 1 of the following

- Plan a party and create an invitation, place cards, and a game
- Flyer
- Make a design and transfer it to a t-shirt (NOTE: Hang your t-shirt on a hanger. Pin your record sheet to the hanger.)
- Design a magazine cover
- Create stationary and matching envelope

Advanced (grades 9 -12): Design 1 of the following

- Twelve month calendar, including graphics, holidays and dates of importance to you
- Book for small children
- A garden or A house
- Develop a product and design advertising for the product
- A menu
- A resort brochure
- Plan a trip and plot your course

Poster Requirements:

- 1. Poster exhibits should have the standardized exhibit card in the lower right hand corner with the 4-H member's name, project and club. You should allow room on your poster for the exhibit card (Height 3½" x Width 4½"). The exhibit card will be available at check-in time at the fair. NOTE: Add your name, club and the date poster was completed in the bottom right corner in permanent ink under the plastic, where the exhibitor card will cover.
- 2. Posters must be 22" x 28" and DISPLAYED HORIZONTALLY and not vertically ■.
- 3. POSTER MUST BE SELF-SUPPORTING (remain standing when leaned at a slight angle). Use heavy cardboard, foam board, or pegboard for stiffness. For sources of heavy cardboard, contact the Extension Office.
- 4. All posters must be covered with clear plastic.

All Posters, Notebooks and Display Boards:

All posters, notebooks, and display boards must include a reference list indicating where information was obtained, giving credit to the original author, to complete the 4-H member's exhibit. This reference list should/might include web site links, people and professionals interviewed, books, magazines, etc. It is recommended this reference list be attached to the back of a poster or display board, be the last page of a notebook, or included as part of the display visible to the public. A judge is not to discredit an exhibit for the manner in which references are listed.
