With Governor Holcomb's state at home declaration, travel within the state is limited to essential trips such as going to the grocery store, gas stations, or health care facilities. The food and agriculture industry is considered part of the critical infrastructure and therefore, travel for farmers and people in the ag industry for work related activities is permitted. However, these travelers will need to have documentation that they are involved in this critical industry. The ISDA does not have a particular form that needs to be completed but they have provided some examples that might be used, although they don't endorse these. Here is an example that farmers and ag industry folks can complete and carry with them when they travel. You will be able to fill this out as well.

"Employees of essential businesses are not required to provide any documentation. Law enforcement will not be stopping drivers on their way to and from work, traveling for an essential activity such as going to the grocery store, or just taking a walk."

Companies can choose to have their employees carry these with them just in case they are stopped. **These are OPTIONAL. Law enforcement WILL NOT stop you to see where you are going.**
