This is both a county and state requirement. Failure to complete this training will result in youth unable to exhibit their animals at the county and/or state fair.

Cattle Tag Day

The 4-H Beef and Dairy Steer Tag-in will be *February 21st* from 5:00 - 7:00 pm in the Cattle Barn at the Clay County 4-H Fairgrounds.

All beef steers, crossbred beef heifers, and dairy steers are required to be tagged. Registered beef heifers and dairy heifers do not have to be brought to tag-in but need to have an RFID tag to exhibit. If you don't have an option of tagging your registered beef heifer or dairy heifer with an RFID tag, you can call a leader to set an appointment up.

All cattle members that are already enrolled in 4-H this year should have received their enrollment packets via mail. If you did not receive your packet or have not enrolled yet, please call the Extension Office.
