- 4. The committee will <u>not</u> accept any entries on glass plates or in cake containers. All entries must be wrapped in either plastic or foil or in a box or Ziploc bag. Cakes should not be boxed.
- 5. A portion of the product will remain for display and the remainder of the product will be sold at the foods auction. Please read auction information.
- 6. Any portion of the product on display that begins to spoil will be disposed of, but the name of the exhibitor and the placing will be displayed for public viewing.
- 7. NO UNCOOKED DAIRY PRODUCTS, SUCH AS WHIPPING CREAM AND CREAM CHEESE.
- 8. NO SOFT PIES (SUCH AS CUSTARD, SUGAR CREAM, ETC.)
