Please read the instructions to re-enroll in 4-H, instructions are on the following link [How To Enroll](#) You can start enrolling on October 1st. Remember if you were in 4-H in 2019-2020 then you already have a profile and **do not need to re-create one**. If you forgot your password, you can re-set it and create a new password. Remember to check your address, phone number, etc. and correct any changes. Everyone must re-enroll for 2020-2021.

The state 4-H enrollment fee is \$15.00 per child.

The max is \$45.00 per family.

Comparing 4-H Online & Fair Entry

We are now going into our 8th year of using 4HOnline and the Fair Entry systems. We still have seasoned 4-H families who are not entering their projects in Fair Entry. [Fair Entry is for Every 4-H'er planning to exhibit at the fair whether it's building or livestock projects.](#) The fair check-in system would work more smoothly if everyone would do their part. Even though the new online system has presented some challenges, we continue to make great strides in making the 4HOnline Enrollment and Fair Entry process easier.

Below is a chart that shows you the purpose of 4-H Online and Fair Entry. Check off the following tasks, as you complete them.

IN 4-H ONLINE YOU WILL

- Enroll in 4-H
- Enroll in projects you intend to complete.
- Identify the following species: Beef, Dairy, Goat, Sheep, Swine, Horse (requirements vary by species).
- Sign up for County and Area Events, (such as 4-H Round-Up or 4-H camp).

IN FAIR ENTRY YOU WILL

- Enter all of your project(s) (except for Poultry) into the correct levels, divisions, or classes that you will be exhibiting at the fair (**Non-Animal and Animal**)
- This system will be used for **ALL projects**, with the exceptions of mini member's and poultry members.
- All livestock must be entered into the

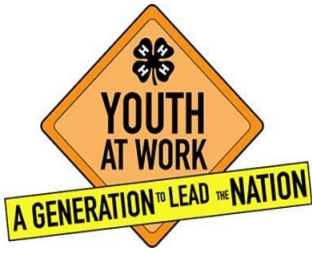
- April 1st: Beef and Dairy Steers must be identified in 4-H Online.
- May 15th: Beef & Dairy Heifers, Horse, Goat, Sheep, and Swine must be identified in 4-H Online. 4-H Online closes at midnight.
- May 15th is the deadline to add or drop projects—this is for ALL projects.

Fair Entry

- May 17: Fair Entry Opens
- All Projects Non-Animal and Livestock enter in Fair Entry May 17—June 15.
- June 15: Fair Entry Closes

Try a New Project

Weather & Climate Science

You will learn basic information about weather and climate science, including what causes variations in weather and why we have different seasons and climates on the earth. In this project you will observe and record weather conditions and learn weather symbols.



Hydroponics (Soilless Growing Systems)

Learn how to grow plants without using soil by placing the plants in a controlled growing environment. Hydroponics is usually grown indoors or in a greenhouse.

Forestry

This project will help you to learn how to identify trees, uses of trees, the benefits of trees, and the importance of our woodlands. A knowledge of trees and woodland management leads to a greater enjoyment of the outdoors.
