REQUIRED FOR FAIR "Fair Entry"

It's that time of year again to enter exhibits in Fair Entry for fair. Fair Entry is the system we use during fair time. Fair Entry helps us print entry labels, check-in projects, create judging sheets, enter results, and create show bills.

Fair Entry is open and located at <u>duboiscounty-indiana.fairentry.com</u>. Families will use same email and password from 4-H Online. 4-H Online sends project/animal information to Fair Entry. We request that all families have their exhibits entered into Fair Entry **by June 30th**, so we can have labels printed and handed to families in advance of project check-in. We are happy to assist members and families with this process.




Club Leader Resources
