## **Livestock Updates**

It is important that all 4-H Clubs follow the check-in times set by the Advisory boards and leaders. Be sure to limit your inner-

grounds traffic during fair. After your animals are checked in, you can only bring a truck/trailer onto the fairgrounds during the hours of 11:00 PM to 10:00 AM, unless otherwise approved. We need to be sure to limit traffic for the safety of our 4-H members and fair-goers alike. If you need feed or something else hauled in after those hours the fair does have a courtesy shuttle available.
