Securing Indiana's Pork Supply

What is the National Secure Pork Supply Plan?

The national Secure Pork Supply (SPS) Continuity of Business Plan is an initiative that provides opportunities for pork producers to voluntarily prepare before a disease outbreak. This will better prepare swine operations that have no evidence of infection to move animals under a movement permit issued by regulatory officials and maintain business continuity during a Foreign Animal Disease (FAD) outbreak. Producers are encouraged to visit www.securepork.org to read more about the National Secure Pork Supply Plan.

How to Participate in Indiana

To integrate the foundational elements of the national Secure Pork Supply plan into Indiana's disease response framework, the Indiana State Board of Animal Health (BOAH) encourages producer participation in Securing Indiana's Pork Supply. As part of participation in Securing Indiana's Pork Supply, the following items must be completed:

- □ "Securing Indiana's Pork Supply" Meeting
- Premises ID Validation
- □ Biosecurity Assessment & Training
- □ Certified Sample Collector Training
- Electronic Movement Permit Training

"Securing Indiana's Pork Supply" Meeting

Description: The objectives of the Securing Indiana's Pork Supply meeting are to provide an opportunity to present Indiana's disease response strategy, to discuss opportunities for disease preparedness such as the Secure Pork Supply plan, and to provide a forum to answer any questions about foreign animal disease response. This meeting can be presented as an overview of disease response or as a more in-depth workshop.

To complete this action item:

- 1. Contact kwerling@boah.in.gov or (317) 607-7071 to schedule a meeting or learn about meetings scheduled in your area.
- 2. Attend a scheduled meeting. Make sure to sign the attendance sheet provided at the meeting to receive credit for attendance. Producers are encouraged to know their site Premises Identification Number(s) and bring them to the meeting.

Premises ID Validation

Description: The Indiana Board of Animal Health validates swine premises by utilizing county parcel records and global reference data to assure the premises address is the 911 location of the pigs. Geocoordinates are pinpointed on the verified farm location, updates to animal owner and/or premises owner information are made, and premises ID barcodes are created for the producer.

To complete this action item:

- 1. Download the *Template for Premises Verification List* from: https://www.in.gov/boah/2889.htm.
- 2. Fill out the necessary information on the Template for Premises Verification List electronically.
- 3. Email the completed template to Dr. Maria Cooper at mcooper1@boah.in.gov.

IN BOAH will validate your premise(s). You will receive confirmation once your premises are validated and an electronic file with your premises ID barcodes.

Biosecurity Assessment & Training

Description: Biosecurity refers to measures that are taken to stop the spread or introduction of disease or harmful infectious agents. Implementing enhanced biosecurity plans will help prevent exposing animals to foot and mouth disease (FMD), classical swine fever (CSF), and African swine fever (ASF). Work with your herd veterinarian to write a site-specific biosecurity plan. Templates for writing a biosecurity plan can be found at: www.securepork.org.

To complete this action item:

- 1. Producers should contact their veterinarian(s) and assess their site(s) biosecurity.
- 2. Veterinarians should download *BOAH's Self-Assessment Checklist for Enhanced Pork Production Biosecurity* from https://www.in.gov/boah/2889.htm or contact BOAH Swine Health at kwerling@boah.in.gov.
 - Complete the document electronically.
 - Submit to BOAH at kwerling@boah.in.gov.

Certified Sample Collector Training

Description: To be authorized to collect diagnostic samples during a foreign animal disease incident, individuals at each site or within a production system must be designated as certified sample collectors and trained by their accredited veterinarian to properly collect blood, oral fluid, tonsil, and spleen samples for diagnostic testing. Completing this action item may prevent the farm from having to wait for federal or state regulatory veterinarians to sample animals for testing.

To complete this action item:

- 1. Veterinarians should reach out to BOAH Swine Health at kwerling@boah.in.gov or visit https://www.in.gov/boah/2889.htm for Certified Sample Collector training materials.
- 2. Veterinarians will designate individuals at each site or within a production system and train these individuals to properly collect blood, oral fluid, tonsil, and spleen samples for diagnostic testing.
- 3. Once training is completed, veterinarians should download the *Certified Sampler List* from https://www.in.gov/boah/2889.htm, complete the form, and submit to BOAH at kwerling@boah.in.gov.

Electronic Movement Permit Training

Description: During a foreign animal disease incident, a movement permit may be required for BOAH to authorize movement of pigs out of, into, or within a specified geographic area. This action item ensures that individuals are trained to properly fill out and submit a movement permit electronically before a disease incident occurs.

To complete this action item:

- 1. Contact BOAH Swine Health at kwerling@boah.in.gov for a copy of the *Indiana Permit to Move Swine & Swine Products*.
- 2. Complete the movement permit electronically.
- 3. Submit via email to BOAH at: SwinePermit@boah.in.gov.

IN BOAH staff will review and email back an approved permit.
