Hands


4-H focuses on hands-on learning and serving.

What is 4-H?



4-H

You may become a 4-H member when you enter the third grade or any grade higher and continue your membership through completion of your Senior year of high school. You may be a member for a maximum of ten years.

How do I enroll?

Enrollment is done annually online at https://v2.4honline.com or by paper form through the Purdue Extension Floyd County Office, Membership is valid October 1– September 30.

How do I find a 4-H Club?

After enrolling in 4-H, you can choose to join the club that best fits your interests, activities, and schedule. You may also be in your school's 4-H club or a classroom club. A list of clubs is available through our website Youth Tab or the Extension Office. A 4-Her may choose to be in multiple clubs.

Does it cost to join 4-H?

The yearly 4-H fee is \$5 for grades K-2 and \$20 for grades 3-12. The best way to pay the fee is by credit card with online enrollment or if you prefer pay with cash or check at the Extension Office. There could be a nominal charge for some of the 4-H project manuals that 4-Hers may choose to purchase. However, some are free downloads found on https://extension.purdue.edu/4h/Pages/projects. Some Clubs also have annual membership dues.
