Project Introduction

The 4-H goat educational program and related activities (such as workshops, tours) provide youth a fun and hands-on learning experience which develops both goat subject skills (such as nutrition, housing, and health care) and life skills (such as responsibility, decision-making, nurturing, and communications) under the direction of caring adults.

Animals DO NOT have to be a winner at the County Fair to show at the State Fair. Visit the Indiana State Fair website for more information.

Exhibit Requirements

Project requirements for completion: All goat project members must answer a 10 question worksheet and complete information in Green Folder / Recordbook before goat check-in. The questions are available from the 4-H office or online.

LEVELS: **GOAT 1** for 4-H members in Grades 3, 4, 5 as of January 1 of current year
 GOAT 2 for 4-H members in Grades 6, 7, 8 as of January 1 of current year
 GOAT 3 for 4-H members in Grades 9, 10, 11, 12 as of Jan.1 of current year

Exhibit options, may do one or more:

- Exhibit animal(s)
- Poster
- Action Demonstration

In addition to or an alternative to exhibiting an animal a 4-H member may exhibit a poster (see *Poster Construction* topic in Handbook) on a topic covered in their manual and/or present an Action Demonstration.

All posters, notebooks, and display boards **MUST** include a reference list indicating where information was obtained, giving credit to the original author, to complete the 4-H member's exhibit. This reference list should/might include web site links, people and professionals interviewed, books, magazines, etc. It is recommended this reference list be attached to the back of a poster or display board, be the last page of a notebook, or included as part of the display visible to the public. A judge is not to discredit an exhibit for the manner in which references are listed.

- 4-H members must have kids and enroll at v.4honline.com by **May 15** of each year. Animals will be checked by the Livestock Committee. After this time all animals must be kept in or under 4-H member's care.
- Goats may be of grade or registered stock.
- Goats must be identified by tags or tattoos. (See BOAH Guidelines for further details.)
- All goats must meet health requirements set by State. No goat shall be exhibited from a herd infected with foot rot, sore mouth, caseous lymphadenitis, or ringworm.
- For more information on goat health requirements, call the Indiana Board of Animal Health (317) 227-0318.
- All goats, male or female, must be “tipped” (horns filed or rounded). Goats may be dehorned.
- Every goat MUST wear a collar and have tie chain available.
- If a 4-H member cannot be at the show or has more than one animal per class, a substitute may show the animal. The substitute must be a Floyd County 4-H member and approved by the Livestock Committee.
- No bucks.
- Grooming shall be done by the 4-H member. Assistance, if needed,
 - shall be given only by a parent, member of the immediate family, or
 - any other Floyd County 4-H member and/or leader.
- During the goat show, only the designated ring man, superintendent, judge, and 4-H members showing an animal are allowed in the arena.
- Exhibitors shall be responsible for their own bedding and cleanliness of their stalls. Each exhibitor must clean their stall and assist with barn teardown after the animals are released.
- Goats will not be released from the Fairgrounds before Sunday morning.
- Barn rules, which can be found under General Livestock Rules, will be posted in each barn, and will be enforced.

No smoking in or around barns at any time.

AUCTION

1. A non-refundable auction fee of \$20.00 and form must be paid for each animal placed in the auction. Make check payable to the Floyd County 4-H Corporation Board, Inc. and mail to P.O. Box 6805, New Albany, IN 47151 by Friday, May 14. After May 14 until Tuesday, June 8, 2021, the fee is \$25.00 per animal. No fees or forms will be accepted after Tuesday, June 8, 2021.
1. ONCE AN ANIMAL IS ON THE SALE BILL, IT MUST SELL. Exception to be made by Livestock Committee or animal not meeting weight requirements.

2. **PICTURES** - A picture of the 4-H member and their poultry animal will be taken for Auction purposes on a date and time to be announced during the Fair. **DRESS CODE** - 4-H T-SHIRT or nice show shirt & SHOW BLUE JEANS. No tank tops, flip flops, or open shoes will be allowed in the show ring. [These pictures are mounted on signs to be given to buyers at the auction to display at their business.](#)
3. Animals sold in auction will become property of the buyer, however, the 4-H member will be expected to maintain and deliver animal upon buyer's request at the close of the livestock barns.
4. **No Auction checks will be distributed until barns and fairgrounds are cleaned and closed up on Sunday, June 13, 2021.**
5. 4-H member give a thank you note to their buyer to trade for check.

Pet Class Goat Project

Any goat that does not fit into a goat category will be classified as a pet goat. Any child who has a healthy pet goat, including non-purebred and purebred may be included in this class. May have "show faults" such as color or size. Must follow goat health requirements and be tipped or dehorned. Pet Class will not be eligible for Grand Champion.

There will be three categories in the Meat Goat Project - **Breeding Does, Market Goats and Other Meat Goats, ie: Pygmy.**

Show bill will be decided upon by entries.

Market (Meat) Division will be goats with milk teeth still in place.

All wether goats will show in the Market (Meat) Division.

All goats, male or female must be enrolled **online** by May 15.

Any exceptions to the above rules will be decided upon by the Livestock Committee. Decisions of the Livestock Committee will be final.
