Project Introduction

The 4-H Pet educational program and related activities provide youth a fun and hands-on learning experiences directly related to animal care, feeding, housing, and management. Youth develop important life skills such as decision making, goal setting, record keeping, time management and communication.

Exhibit Introduction

All poster exhibits are to be displayed horizontally, sized 22" x 28", mounted on a firm backing (foam-core board or other) and covered in clear plastic or transparent material. Place standard identification label with your name, grade and county in the lower right-hand corner of the poster.

All posters, notebooks, and display boards **MUST** include a reference list indicating where information was obtained, giving credit to the original author, to complete the 4-H member's exhibit. This reference list should/might include web site links, people and professionals interviewed, books, magazines, etc. It is recommended this reference list be attached to the back of a poster or display board, be the last page of a notebook, or included as part of the display visible to the public. A judge is not to discredit an exhibit for the manner in which references are listed.

Exhibit Requirements

Requirements the same for each level:

Level 1~ Grades 3, 4, 5

Level 2~ Grades 6, 7, 8

Level 3~ Grades 9, 10, 11, 12

Exhibit:

Choose one of the following:

- A poster on topic covered in workbook
- An Action Demonstration
- Exhibit a small animal (reptile, herptile, birds or mammal)

ANIMAL MUST BE EXHIBITED IN SUITABLE CAGE OR CONTAINER.

ANIMAL MUST BE OF NON-POISONOUS VARIETY.

4-H MEMBER MUST BE RESPONSIBLE FOR ALL CARE WHILE ON EXHIBIT.

INCLUDE A LABEL IDENTIFYING TYPE OF PET ON CAGE OR CONTAINER.
