Project Introduction

The 4-H Travelogue Project assists the youth in planning, documenting, and evaluating travel plans. Adventures can be ones that have already been taken, ones that are planned, or ones that exist only in dreams.

Exhibit Introduction

All poster exhibits are to be displayed horizontally, sized 22" x 28", mounted on a firm backing (foam-core board or other) and covered in clear plastic or transparent material. Place standard identification label with your name, grade and county in the lower right-hand corner of the poster.

All posters, notebooks, and display boards **MUST** include a reference list indicating where information was obtained, giving credit to the original author, to complete the 4-H member's exhibit. This reference list should/might include web site links, people and professionals interviewed, books, magazines, etc. It is recommended this reference list be attached to the back of a poster or display board, be the last page of a notebook, or included as part of the display visible to the public. A judge is not to discredit an exhibit for the manner in which references are listed.

Exhibit Requirements

Requirements are the same for each level. Exhibits will be entered by grade level as indicated here:

Level 1: Grades 3 - 5

Level 2: Grades 6 - 8

Level 3: Grades 9 - 12

Exhibit:

Make a notebook of your travels. Include the following in the notebook for a make-believe or real trip.

- What has to be done at home before we leave checklist

- Packing checklist
- Map showing route going and returning
- Travel Journal pages (one page for each day)
- Memories pages for places visited; for make-believe trips contact the Chamber of Commerce, any city, state, and ask for maps and brochures on places of interest in that city
- Best/Worst Page
- Floyd County Record Sheet
