WOODWORKING-County & State Fair Project

There may be one woodworking article and one woodworking poster selected from each level for State Fair exhibit, for a total of 4 articles and 4 posters.

A completed record sheet signed by your 4-H leader **must** be presented, along with your exhibit, at project check-in at the fair.

This project is divided into four levels according to the following breakdown:

Level A	Grades 3 & 4
Level B	Grades 5 & 6
Level C	Grades 7, 8, & 9
Level D	Grades 10 and above

General Rules For Posters

- 1. Posters must be 22" x 28", exhibited horizontally, must have a firm backing and a transparent covering.
- 2. See "How To Prepare A Poster Project" in this handbook for details on preparing posters.
- 3. All posters, notebooks, and display boards include a reference list indicating where information was obtained, giving credit to the original author, to complete the 4-H member's exhibit. This reference list should/might include web site links, people and professionals interviewed, books, magazines, etc. It is recommended this reference list be attached to the back of a poster or display board, be the last page of a notebook, or included as part of the display visible to the public. A judge is not to discredit an exhibit for the manner in which references are listed or a lack thereof.

Exhibit Requirements

Level A - Exhibit one of the following:

- An article made using the plans in the Level A manual or in the additional plans provided. Tools that pose limited safety concerns can be used to complete the exhibit. Examples include: all hand tools, and power tools such as power screwdriver, pad sander, cordless drill. Tools that pose greater potential for injuries should not be used. Examples include: table saw, router, band saw.
- b. Poster on any topic covered in the Level A manual.
- Level B Exhibit one of the following:
 - a. An article made according to the Level B manual plans, additional plans, or one that uses the skills discussed in either Level A or Level B. Tools that pose limited safety concerns can be used to complete the exhibit. Examples include: all hand tools, and power tools such as power screwdriver, pad sander, cordless drill. Tools that pose greater potential for injuries should not be used. Examples include: table saw, router, band saw.
- b. Poster on any topic covered in the Level B manual.
- Level C Exhibit one of the following:
 - a. A woodworking project of your choice, using only those skills and tools covered in Levels A, B, and C.
 - b. Poster on any topic covered in the Level C manual.
- Level D Exhibit one of the following:
 - a. A woodworking project of your choice, using only those skills and tools covered in Levels A, B, C, and D.

b. Poster on any topic covered in the Level D manual.
