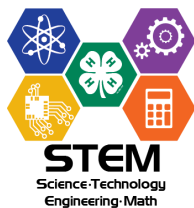
**Poultry Workshops**—Check your Poultry ID letter about the workshops. They are **April 22nd, May 20th, and June 24th**.

## Fun Day Learning STEM Activities

Have you ever wondered how science, technology, engineering, and math are used in a theme park? Join Purdue Extension on **Friday June 18th from 8:45 a.m.-4 p.m. Central Time at Holiday World Splashin' Safari** for a behind the scenes look at how STEM is used to design a theme park.



**Youth grades 6-12** will tour (and ride) different attractions through the theme park while identifying STEM in use. Each youth will receive a t-shirt, backpack, lunch, and all materials needed to complete the activities. Weather permitting, several activities will take place in Splashin' Safari, so please plan accordingly.

## YQCA Training

In order to be eligible to show livestock at the county and state fair, youth must complete Youth Quality Care of Animals—YQCA Training. **This is for beef cattle, dairy cattle, swine, sheep, meat goats, dairy goats, poultry, and rabbits.** Masks will still need to be worn and social distancing will be followed. There are 2 more dates available for in-person training with Mark Kepler:

- ◆ Monday, April 12—6 p.m.
- ◆ Thursday, May 6—6 p.m.

### Instructions for signing up for your YQCA in-person training:

1. Contact the office to get a YQCA coupon code for your in-person training—223-3397.
2. Go to [yqca.learn-grow.io](http://yqca.learn-grow.io) and select “sign in with your 4-HOnline account”.
3. You will be prompted to select a state, then enter the login information for your 4HOnline account. After logging in you will be given a list of active family members. Select a family member and start the account creation process.
4. When you see the course list, select the \$3 instructor led training appropriate for the 4-H member’s age.
5. Select your payment method and enter the coupon code.
6. Repeat for any additional family members.
7. Once you have attended the training the instructor will mark attendees complete within 2 days following the training.
8. Return to the course menu and print your certificate.

Again, this year, the \$3 fee has been covered by the Livestock Committee for the **in-person training only**. If you choose to do the online training, you will be responsible for the \$12 fee.

### Mini 4-H members DO NOT need to do YQCA Training.

### YQCA Certificate

A few of you have asked if you need to send us a copy of your certificate. **If you do the training online, you WILL definitely need to send us a copy of your certificate.** If you do the training in person, it will not be necessary, but it’s okay if you want to send a copy.



## Animal Grooming for Livestock at the State Fair

The animal grooming policy at the Indiana State Fair has been changed as described below:

**4-H Exhibitors may receive clipping and grooming assistance from members of their immediate family (father, mother, and siblings), from a current Indiana 4-H member, and from individuals enrolled in the Indiana 4-H Approved Animal Grooming Assistance Program. Temporary guardianships are not permitted and shall result in immediate disqualification.**

Again this year in addition to completing the application, participants must complete the online Animal Ethics modules every three years. With the different year we experienced last year, it was decided to use the modules for 1 more year. If applicants completed the training modules in 2019 or 2020 they **do not** have to complete them again (unless they want too). The modules will be available on May 15th as they are in the process of being reimaged. This program will be required for those wishing to assist 4-H members with livestock at the Indiana State Fair. Participants will receive a letter of confirmation once they have completed the program. The website is:

## 2021 Indiana 4-H Animal Identification



The following table lists the different animal species and the respective form of identification that is required for a 4-H member to be eligible to show in the 4-H livestock shows at the 2021 Indiana State Fair. The animal ID information must be entered in the Indiana 4-H Online enrollment system by the respective deadlines. Missing, incomplete or incorrect animal ID information could result in state fair ineligibility for that particular animal.

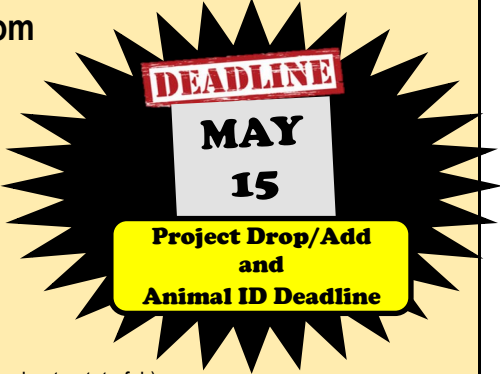
