


The beginning date has changed—

- FairEntry.com will be open from now through June 15 for Non-livestock, (Commercial Building, State Garden, and State Projects).
- ◆ FairEntry.com will be open from now through July 1 for Livestock and other animals. ALL ANIMALS including poultry, rabbits, dogs, and cats need to be entered.
- If you have more than one child in 4-H enter everyone's projects BEFORE submitting or you will get locked out of the system until the office staff approves your submission.
- MINI 4-H projects **DO NOT** need to be entered in FairEntry.

Animal Grooming for Livestock at the State Fair



The animal grooming policy at the Indiana State Fair has been changed as described below:

4-H Exhibitors may receive clipping and grooming assistance from members of their immediate family (father, mother, and siblings), from a current Indiana 4-H member, and from individuals enrolled in the Indiana 4-H Approved Animal Grooming Assistance Program. Temporary guardianships are not permitted and shall result in immediate disqualification.

Again this year in addition to completing the application, participants must complete the online Animal Ethics modules every three years. With the different year we experienced last year, it was decided to use the modules for 1 more year. If applicants completed the training modules in 2019 or 2020 they **do not** have to complete them again (unless they want too). The modules will be available on May 15th as they are in the process of being reimaged. This program will be required for those wishing to assist 4-H members with livestock at the Indiana State Fair. Participants will receive a letter of confirmation once they have completed the program. The website is:

YQCA Training

In order to be eligible to show livestock at the county and state fair, youth must complete Youth Quality Care of Animals—YQCA Training. This is for beef cattle, dairy cattle, swine, sheep, meat goats, dairy goats, poultry, and rabbits. There are no more in-person trainings scheduled this year, so you will need to do the training online. Mini 4-H Members DO NOT need the training.

Online Instructions:

- Go to yqca.learngrow.io and select "sign in with your 4-H Online account".
- You will be prompted to select a state, then enter the login information for your 4-H Online account.
- After logging in you will be given a list of active family members. Select a family member and start the account creation process. If you get an error message, log out and back in again.

You will just select one that says online training and you will need to pay the \$12 fee.
