

# BICYCLE

## LEVEL/GRADE:

LEVEL 1 (Bicycling for Fun BU 8334) – Grades 3, 4, 5

LEVEL 2 (Wheels in Motion BU 8335) – Grades 6, 7, 8

LEVEL 3 – Grades 9, 10, 11, 12

## RULES:

1. Community Judging of all 4-H Bicycle projects will be done at Project Check-In.
2. Posters must be displayed horizontally, sized 22" x 28", mounted on a firm backing (foam core board or other), and covered in clear plastic or other transparent material.
3. A different topic should be selected each year.
4. You may also participate in the 4-H Bicycle Rodeo which will be held in July at the Greene County 4-H Fairgrounds. You will bring your bicycle helmet, take a written test, and ride a course. One Jr. and one Sr. member will advance to the State Fair Bicycle Rodeo.
5. All posters, notebooks, and display boards must include a reference list indicating where information was obtained, giving credit to the original author, to complete the 4-H member's exhibit. This reference list should/might include web site links, people and professionals interviewed, books, magazines, etc. It is recommended this reference list be attached to the back of a poster or display board, be the last page of a notebook, or included as part of the display visible to the public. A judge is not to discredit an exhibit for the manner in which references are listed.

## EXHIBITS:

### LEVEL 1 (GRADES 3-5)

1. Exhibit a poster on one of the following topics from your manual:
2. Sign Language – Identifying traffic signs
3. Body Protection – Wearing protective equipment
4. Just the Right Fit – Fitting a bike
5. Getting to Know Your Bike – Identifies bike parts and their purpose
6. Taking Turns – Signaling and turning a corner
7. Be Road Smart – Locating Road Hazards
8. Finding Your Groove

### LEVEL 2 (GRADES 6-8)

Exhibit one (1) poster on one of the following topics from your manual:

1. Types of Bicycles – shopping for a bicycle
2. Bicycle Maintenance and Repair
3. Traffic Manners – being a safe and courteous cyclist
4. Shifty Maneuvers – using gears efficiently
5. Traffic Manners – being a safe and courteous cyclist

### LEVEL 3 (GRADES 9-12)

Exhibit one (1) poster on one of the following topics from your manual:

1. Develop a bike hike plan
2. Promoting a bike friendly community
3. Cycling for life – good nutrition for cyclists, careers involving cycling, and healthy living
