

## **RABBITS: POSTER**

### **LEVEL/GRADE:**

Level: Beginner (Grades 3, 4, & 5)

Level: Intermediate (Grades 6, 7, & 8)

Level: Advanced (Grades 9, 10, 11, & 12)

### **RULES:**

1. Community judging of all 4-H Rabbit Posters will be done at Project Check-In.
2. Posters must be displayed horizontally, sized 22" X 28", mounted on a firm backing (foam core, board or other), and covered in clear plastic or other transparent material.
3. A different topic should be selected each year.
4. Ownership of a rabbit is not required.
5. All posters, notebooks, and display boards must include a reference list indicating where information was obtained, giving credit to the original author, to complete the 4-H member's exhibit. This reference list should/might include web site links, people and professionals interviewed, books, magazines, etc. It is recommended this reference list be attached to the back of a poster or display board, be the last page of a notebook, or included as part of the display visible to the public. A judge is not to discredit an exhibit for the manner in which references are listed.

### **EXHIBITS:**

#### **BEGINNER - GRADES 3-5**

Exhibit a poster on one of the following topics:

- Rabbit Care
- Rabbit Breeds
- Hutch Maintenance
- Determining Rabbit Costs
- Treating my rabbit with care and respect
- Rabbit Responsibilities
- Grooming Skills

#### **INTERMEDIATE - GRADES 6-8**

Exhibit a poster on one of the following topics:

- My Rabbit's Safety
- A Rabbit Clinic
- Careers Related to Rabbits
- Feeding my Rabbit
- Insects and Pests
- Symptoms of Ill Health

#### **ADVANCED - GRADES 9-12**

Exhibit a poster on one of the following topics:

- Understanding a rabbit show
- Rabbit Genetics
- Rabbit Organs and Systems
- Exploring Careers
- Issues of animal welfare/rights
- Teaching Others
- Having Fun Learning

### **STATE FAIR:**

There will be one state fair entry from each level.
