

SHOOTING SPORTS

RIFLE

Meetings will be held at the Greene County 4-H Fairgrounds, at the Shooting Sports Range.

LEVEL/GRADE

Level 1 – Grade 3-5 (Age 9-11)

Level 2 – Grade 6-8 (Age 12-14)

Level 3 – Grade 9-12 (Age 15 +)

RULES

1. In order to attend the Rifle Club meetings, members must have first completed their 4-H enrollment forms.
2. Attendance at the safety meeting IS required BEFORE you are allowed to shoot.
3. There will be an additional \$10 due collected. These dues will be used to purchase ammunition.
4. Only 4-H members will be allowed to be at the equipment and firing lines.
5. The use of your own rifle equipment is encouraged. It must be inspected by the 4-H leader prior to use.
6. Any member demonstrating unsafe behavior may be asked to leave the meetings.
7. A white Achievement card must be filled out and turned in at the fair.
8. A poster IS required for Division 1 Grades 3-5. It is encouraged that it should detail safety or line procedures for Greene County 4-H Rifle. We would LOVE to see Division 2 complete projects as well, but it is not required. **You must sign up for shooting sports education in Fair Entry!**
9. Division 3 (Grades 9-12) are required to produce a project that features teaching and instructional elements of rifle marksmanship or leadership through the shooting sports. **You must sign up for shooting sports education in Fair Entry!**

EXHIBITS

IMPORTANT NOTES:

- Firearms or ready to shoot bows are not allowed to be exhibited. Unstrung bows are permissible.
- Live ammunition is not allowed to be exhibited (no powder or primer).
- An arrow with its arrowhead attached must be displayed in a secure case. An arrowhead without the arrow attached must be displayed in a secure case. An arrow may be displayed unsecured if its arrowhead is removed. Modern broadhead arrows are not allowed to be exhibited. Displays involving firearms or bows may be exhibited as a photographic display on a poster or in a notebook following grade level guidelines.
- Handmade items must include information explaining how the project was made and its intended use. Photos are encouraged.

LEVEL 1 – GRADE 3-5

Display a poster showing what was learned in the project. This can be anything from safety to parts of the rifle. Title the poster "What I Learned in Rifle" or simply "Rifle". You may use a subtitle. Poster must be displayed horizontally, sized 22" by 28", mounted on a firm background, and covered in a clear plastic or other transparent material.

LEVEL 2 – GRADE 6-8

Choose one of the following options:

1. Poster – see requirements above.
2. A small project or model no larger than 18" by 18" by 36"
3. Notebook, showing how a rifle item was made or how you completed your project.

LEVEL 3 – GRADE 9-12

Choose one of the following options:

1. Poster – see requirements above.
2. Project or model of any size and explanation of costs and procedures
3. Notebook, showing how a Rifleman collects information or how you completed your project.

STATE FAIR ENTRY

All Shooting Sports Projects will be judged collectively. Only one project per level will advance to State Fair.
