STRAWBERRIES

LEVEL/GRADE:

LEVEL 1 – Grades 3, 4, 5 LEVEL 2 – Grades 6, 7, 8 LEVEL 3 – Grades 9, 10, 11, 12

RULES:

- 1. Community Judging of all 4-H Strawberry Projects will be at Project Check-In.
- 2. You should read the information in your 4-H Strawberry Manual (4-H 38). If you have any problems or questions, talk to your parent or 4-H Leader.
- 3. There are optional experiments for third year and advanced members. It is highly recommended that one of these experiments be conducted each year for third year members and above

EXHIBIT:

LEVEL 1

- 1. You should plant a small number of plants the first year (25 to 100).
- 2. An exhibit shall consist of a box containing 3 growing plants from your strawberry patch and a picture of your strawberry patch. Place name on picture and securely attach to plant container.

LEVEL 2

1. Exhibit berries that you harvest from your own plants. Two quarts of unsweetened, frozen strawberries from your patch. Berries are to be exhibited whole, with cap and about 1/2" stem.

LEVEL 3

- 1. Continue with your renovated strawberry patches, keeping accurate production records
- 2. Develop a variety, spacing or fertility trial comparison plot, keeping accurate records. Go on a tour of the experimental plot of other 4-H members
- 3. Exhibit First year of trials: Berries you harvest from your renovated berry patch and/or your experimental plots or renovated planting.

Second year of trials: Berries from each of your plots.

If berries are unavailable due to renovating patch, a poster can be exhibited.
