Project Title: Scrapbooking

Description:

This project allows youth to use their own creativity in designing scrapbook pages from their memories.

Exhibit Guidelines:

Each scrapbook album must have a front and back cover with pages firmly attached between the covers. The page layout must be left-to-right like a book. Exhibit tag can go on the **inside** front cover, so that it does not ruin the outside album cover.

One side of the album page counts as one page for judging (ex. 5 pages completed front and back equals 10 finished pages.)

Each scrapbook album will have at least 10 pages completed for judging. Pages to be judged should be flagged with sticky note paper. If no pages are marked for judging, the first 10 pages in the scrapbook will be judged.

Photographs should be included but are not required on every page. Memorabilia should also be included but is not required on every page.

Judges evaluating exhibits should recognize individual differences and creativity, therefore using information in this document as a guide rather than a requirement.

Exhibit Class Guidelines:

Beginner (grades 3-5 suggested)

• At least 10 pages completed. Youth should focus on labeling of photos and memorabilia with names, dates, places, etc.

Intermediate (grades 6-8 suggested)

At least 10 pages completed. Youth should focus on beginner level requirements as well as
capturing their memories with captions or words recording the happenings of the photos
and memorabilia.

Advanced (grades 9-12 suggested)

• At least 10 pages completed. Youth should focus on beginner and intermediate level requirements as well as storytelling – writing thoughts, feelings, and telling a complete story or memory on most pages. (IMPORTANT NOTE: Not every photo has a complete story, so choose the ones deserving of this when you are thinking of your page designs. It

is acceptable to put several photographs on a page and just use one of them to tell a story. Label/caption other photos on the page.)
