Creating a New 4-H Online Account

NOTE: If you had an account in 4-H Online 1.0, enter the login information for your existing account and skip to Member Enrollment.

1. Go to v2.4HOnline.com
2. Click "Don't have an account?"
3. Select Indiana from the drop-down menu
4. Choose your county from the drop-down menu
5. Complete your family's info
6. Click Create Account
7. Enter your family's address info
8. Click Verify
9. If you create a new account and an existing account is found, click confirm and continue to logging in with an existing 4-H Online account

Adding a New Member to the Family

1. Enter the member's info
2. Click Next
3. Complete the "About You" form with the requested info
4. Click Next
5. Select your method of participation
6. Click Finish
- *Continue to Youth and Mini 4-H Member Enrollment***
7. Click Select Projects
8. Select the Club with which you want your project to be associated
9. Click Add next to the project you want to add to the member's enrollment
10. Repeat steps 7-9 for each project in which you would like to participate.
11. Click the trash icon to remove any projects
12. Click the Next button once all the member's projects have been added
13. Click "Show Questions"
14. Complete the enrollment questions.
15. Complete the Health form fields and Consents
16. Click Next
17. Complete the Consents
18. Click Next
19. If applicable, review the fees for the member.
20. If paying by credit card, you will need to Add a New Card.
21. If you choose to pay with check to your County Extension Office, select **Payment for this invoice will be collected at HARRISON County.**
22. If you select to pay with credit card you will be redirected to enter that info
23. Review Enrollment info
24. Click Submit

Youth and Mini Member Enrollment

1. Click Select Clubs
2. Select the County in which your Club is located
3. Click add next to the Club you would like to join
4. Repeat steps 1-3 to add all of the Clubs in which you would like to participate
5. If you have enrolled in more than one club, be sure the Primary club is marked correctly. If not, click Change to Primary button to mark a different Club
6. Click the trash icon to remove a Club from the list.
7. Once all of your Clubs are added, click Next

Thanking Loretta Byrne for 50 years of 4-H service

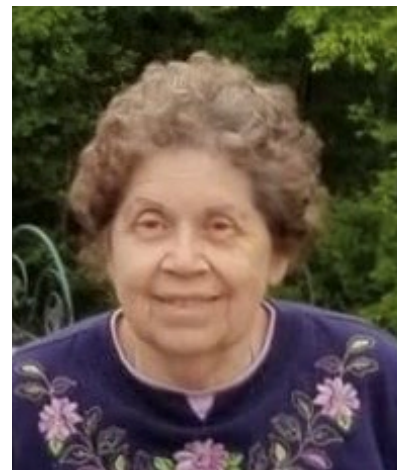

She was a 10-year member as well as her five siblings, three sons, and other family members. She has served on several county, state, and regional 4-H committees. She has a lot of wonderful memories from attending state conferences, and the North Central Leaders Conference in South Dakota and Minnesota. She judges 4-H projects in surrounding

counties and at the State Fair. She was a coach for the County Horticulture team and worked with the Share-the-Fun and Fashion Revue programs for several years.

She is always eager to pass on her knowledge of different craft projects, cake decorating, and poster making to 4-H members in Harrison County.

She was a Harrison County Extension Homemaker member for about 40 years, serving in all club officer positions along with county committees. She was the office manager for the Purdue Extension Harrison County Office for over 41 years.

Besides 4-H, she is actively involved with her church, serving as the church organist and chairman of the women's



group. She also volunteers at the Harrison County Hospital in the gift shop and cafeteria. She believes there is nothing better for today's youth than 4-H, and all the things they can learn to help them in life, the opportunities and experiences, and the friendships that last a life time. Loretta says helping and working with young people through 4-H has been the most heartfelt experience of her life.

What is Mini 4-H?

Mini 4-H is designed to introduce you and your child to the 4-H program. Mini 4-H Members do not attend club meetings or keep records, though being involved with a club may be beneficial to the child as older 4-H members can help them learn about 4-H. Most projects can be completed with items found in your home. This is an excellent way for children to learn by doing and exhibit a project at the fair. Mini 4-H members also have the opportunity to attend workshops and a day camp just for Mini 4-H'ers during the summer.

Teens as Teachers

February 2021

Teens as Teachers is an opportunity for teams of 3-5 youth and one adult mentor to learn how to be teachers and subject matter experts of a topic of their choice, and are empowered to deliver programming to their community. This training is for youth in grades 8-11. In addition to studying the subject matter of their choice, youth will learn fundamentals of hands-on learning, ages and stages of youth development, public speaking, and lesson planning.

Teens as Teachers will be held in February, 2021, using a combination of virtual and in-person programming. 3 virtual, one-hour sessions will be held on February 2, 9, and 16, each from 6:30-7:30 p.m. (ET)- these are designed to give you the basics of how to be an effective teen teacher. You can join these sessions via Zoom from the comfort of your home. One morning session will be held on February 27, from 10 a.m. - 12:30 p.m. You will join together with your team for an in-person training facilitated by presenters joining you virtually. This session will focus on your subject matter of choice (see below for options). The in-person training will follow all safety protocols. Registration fee for the Teens as Teachers program is \$35/youth participant. There is no registration fee for one adult mentor/team. Teams will register through their county 4-H educator. Educators will register teams through 4HOnline. Registration deadline is January 26, 2021. Please let Rebecca know if you are interested!

Ag Innovator's Experience: Curbing Our Carbon Appetite Challenge

The carbon cycle impacts the entire population no matter their residence as we are all consumers of food and tangible goods. This program will focus on incorporating hands-on learning into 4-H Healthy Living and STEM Programs. Youth will participate in the "Curbing Our Carbon Appetite Challenge," an educational experience developed by a Land Grant University, focusing on the understanding of the carbon cycle, carbon sequestration, and the important role both the consumer and the producer have in contributing to a healthy, sustainable food supply to feed a growing world. The activity will have an agricultural basis that incorporates STEM skills, teamwork, communication and workforce development. Teen leaders will be trained and engaged to lead youth participants in the educational activity beginning in February 2021 and continuing through July 2021. Each team will receive a kit including materials and activities for youth in grades 3-8. Please let Rebecca know if you are interested!

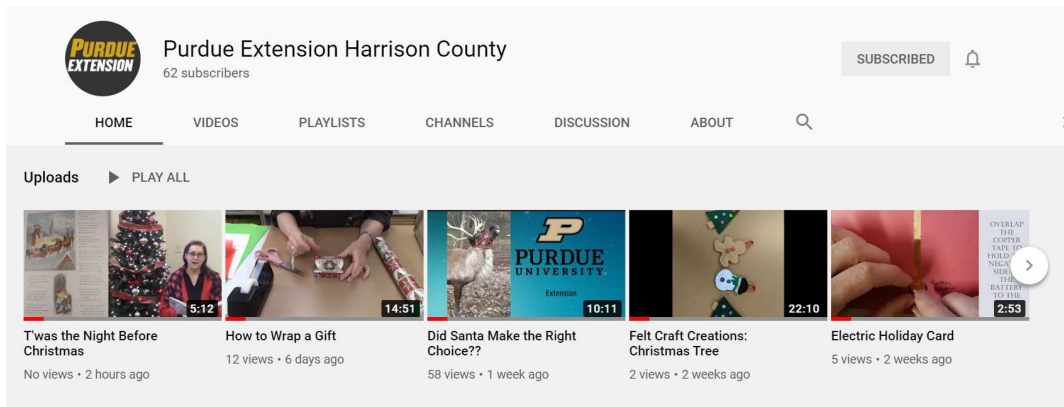


1. Dial the in-country number

3. If the meeting hasn't started yet, press # to wait
4. You will be prompted to enter your unique participant ID. This only applies if you have joined on the computer or mobile device or are a panelist in a webinar. Press # to skip
5. You may be prompted to enter a meeting passcode followed by a #. This will be included in your invite provided by the host

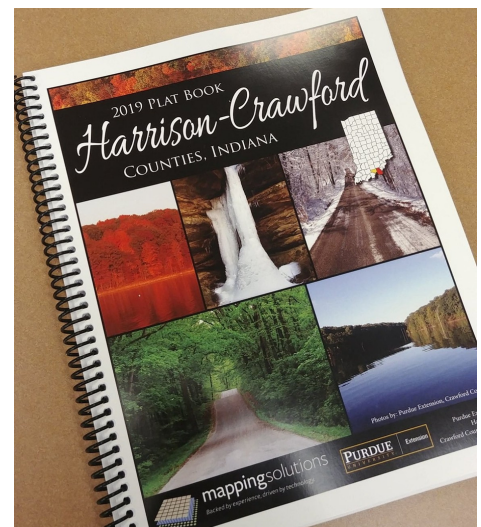
