4-H MEMBER OF THE YEAR

Due October 1

This award is a one-time award which is open to anyone in Harrison County 4-H grades 3rd-12th. It will consist of an interview with a non 4-H panel, a cover letter, a life skills resume using 3-5 life skills and your 4-H record of achievement. This will be similar to the state scholarship forms that 10th-12th grade members currently use for state scholarships. This award will also be given out at our fall awards banquet. The above criteria and application will be due to the office by OCTOBER 1st. This award will be an embroidered jacket. (Examples of applications are available at the office)

HARRISON COUNTY JUNIOR LEADERS

WHAT IS JUNIOR LEADERS?

The responsibility of leadership, the challenge of assisting others, and the opportunity to expand your personal experiences best sums up the objectives of the Junior Leader project. Harrison County 4-H Junior Leader is currently the only opportunity to serve as a leader at the county level. Many 4-H members serve as leaders in their local 4-H clubs, but not many get to experience leadership at the county level.

Junior Leaders must be in grade 7 or above, prior to January 1st.

- Achieve a broad understanding of the meaning of leadership and the qualities of a leader.
- Understand and practice ethical character.
- Participate in team building.

- Improve written, verbal and interpersonal communication skills.
- Gain self-confidence and self-respect.
- Practice and acquire leadership skills.
- Think critically and problem-solve.
- Develop and practice empathy for others.
- Understand and develop a sense of belonging with others and your community.
- Develop and improve your resume for college and work applications after high school.
- Discover career pathways and get involved in your community through service-learning opportunities.




WHAT IS A RAIN GARDEN?

Rain gardens are areas of the landscape designed to catch rainwater long enough to allow it to percolate slowly back into the groundwater rather than run off the soil. Rain gardens help recharge groundwater, improve the water quality of streams and rivers, reduce flooding, and provide cover for wildlife and butterflies.

4-H ONLINE FAMILY ENROLLMENT GUIDE

OPEN ENROLLMENT BEGINS OCTOBER 1

The 2021-2022 4-H Program Year starts on October 1st! Enroll to join us for another great program year by going to v2.4HOnline.com. Traditional 4-H Members, Mini 4-H Members, and Adult Volunteers must enroll each year to participate in the program. Start off the year right by getting your enrollment done early. Step by step instructions are included in the newsletter, in your email, on our website at extension.purdue.edu/Harrison, and on our Facebook page.

What's the Difference Between FairEntry and 4-H Online?

4-H Online is the program enrollment website. This is where you register for the 4-H program year as well as the projects, project animals, and events you will be participating in throughout the year. FairEntry is the fair entry database. This is where you submit the projects or animals you specifically intend to exhibit or show at the county fair. FairEntry does not open until later in the year, and you must have your projects registered on 4-H Online before submitting them on the fair entry database.

Creating a New 4-H Online Account

- 1. Go to v2.4HOnline.com
- 2. Click "Don't have an account?" if you have never enrolled in 4-H before using 4-H Online.
- 3. Select Indiana from the drop-down menu.
- 4. Choose your county from the drop-down menu.
- 5. Complete your family's information.
- 6. Click the Create Account button.
- 7. Enter your family's address information.
- 8. Click the Verify button.
- 9. If you create a new account and an existing account is found, click the Confirm button and continue to Logging in with an Existing 4-H Online Account.



Logging in to an Existing Account

- 1. Go to v2.4HOnline.com
- 2. Enter your email address and password.
- 3. Click Sign-In
- 4. Continue to Youth and Mini 4-H Member

 Enrollment to re-enroll youth members, to Adult
 Enrollment to re-enroll adult members or to
 Adding New Members to add new Family
 Members.

If you have forgotten your password, click "Reset Password?" to receive an email with a link to set a new password.

Adding a New Family Member

- 1. Enter the member's information.
- 2. Click the Next button.
- 3. Complete the "About You" form with requested information
- 4. Click the Next button.
- 5. Select your method of participation
- 6. Click the Finish button.

If you have selected that you will be participating as New or Returning Club Member, continue to <u>Youth and Mini 4-H Member Enrollment.</u>

If you are participating as an Adult Volunteer, continue to the <u>Adult Volunteer Enrollment</u> instructions.

Youth and Mini Member Enrollment

If you are returning to 4-H, your member record will be listed on the family Member List. Click "Enroll Now" under 4-H. If you are a new member and your name is not yet listed, click "Add Member" and follow the steps for "Adding a New Family Member," then continue to Step 1 below.

- 1. Select the member's Grade and click Next.
- 2. Select to Confirm that you would like to enroll as a Club Member.
- 3. Click the Select Clubs button.
- 4. Select the County in which your Club is located.
- 5. Click Add next to the Club you would like to join.
- 6. Repeat steps 1-3 to add all of the Clubs in which you would like to participate.
- 7. If you have enrolled in more than one club, be sure the Primary club is marked correctly. If not, click the Change to Primary button to mark a different Club as your Primary Club.
- 8. Click the trash can icon to remove a Club from the list.
- 9. Once all of your Clubs are added, click Next at the bottom of the screen.
- 10. Click Select Projects.
- 11. Select the Club with which you want your project to be associated.
- 12. Click the Add button next to the project you want to add to the member's enrollment.
- 13. Repeat steps 10-12 for each project in which you would like to participate.
- 14. Click the trash can icon to remove any projects.
- 15. Click the Next button once all the member's projects have been added.
- 16. Click "Show Questions"
- 17. Complete the enrollment questions. Some of the questions will be completed for you based on what you entered when you created your record.
- 18. Complete the Health form fields and Consents.
- 19. Click the Next button at the bottom of the screen when you are done.
- 20. Complete the Consents
- 21. Click the Next button at the bottom of the page when you are finished.
- 22. If applicable, review the fees for the member.
- 23. If you are choosing to pay with credit card, you will need to Add New Card. This will redirect you to a new site. This site is not mobile friendly so you will need to be on a computer for this step using Google Chrome, Mozilla Firefox, or Safari web browsers.
- 24. If choosing to pay with check to your County Extension Office, select Payment for this invoice will be collected at Harrison County.
- 25. If you selected to pay with credit card you will be redirected to enter that information. Fill out all the required fields noted with an * and then click Continue. Upon completion you will be returned to 4-H Online.
- 26. Review the enrollment information.
- 27. Once you have verified that the clubs and projects are listed correctly, click the Submit button.

You will receive an email to let you know your enrollment has been submitted. You will receive another email when your County Extension office has approved your enrollment. You may view the enrollment status on the Member List. Any enrollments that have fees to be paid by credit card will process when the County Extension Office approves the enrollment. Should the transaction be declined, you will receive an email notification. It will include a link to login so that you may add another card or change your payment method.

Adult Volunteer Enrollment

If you are returning to 4-H, your Volunteer record will be listed on the family Member List. Click "Enroll Now" under the Program in which you would like to enroll. If you are a new volunteer and your name is not yet listed, click "Add Member" and follow the steps for "Adding a New Family Family," then continue to Step 1 below.

- 1. Click Select Volunteer Types to indicate how you are planning to participate in the program throughout the year. At least one Volunteer Type is required during the enrollment process. You may add additional Volunteer Types later, if needed.
- 2. Select a Volunteer Type.
- 3. Click Add next to your Volunteer Type Role.
- 4. Repeat steps 1-4 for each Volunteer type that you would like to participate as.
- 5. Click the small trash can icon to remove any Volunteer Types.
- 6. Click Next.
 - NOTE: if you did not select A Club or Project Volunteer type you can skip to step 15.*
- 7. If you have selected a Club Volunteer Type, click "Select Clubs" to choose the Clubs with which you would like to Volunteer. NOTE: If you did not select a Club Volunteer Type, you will not see this screen.
- 8. Select the County, Club and Volunteer type that corresponds with the Club in which you would like to participate.
- 9. Click Add next to the Club.
- 10. Repeat steps 8-10 for each Club in which you would like to participate.
- 11. If you have selected to participate as a Project leader, you will be prompted to select a Project. Click Select Projects. NOTE: If you did not select a Project Volunteer Type, you will not see this screen.
- 12. Select Club if you are a project leader for a specific Club, and select the Club. Then select the Project Volunteer Type that best describes your involvement.
- 13. If you are a Project Volunteer for the entire County associated with your Family Profile, select County.
- 14. Click Add next to the Project that you will be working with.
- 15. Click Show Questions.
- 16. Complete the Questions section.
- 17. When you are finished, click the Next button.
- 18. If your Institution requires a Health Form, complete the Health Information and Consent.
- 19. Click the Next button at the bottom of the page.
- 20. Complete the Consents.
- 21. Click Next at the bottom of the page.
- 22. Payment isn't necessary for Adult Volunteers. Select Next at the bottom of the page.
- 23. Click Submit.

REQUIRED FOR ALL 4-H ADULT VOLUNTEERS

4-H Volunteers must take the Youth Safety Training **every year** to be able to become an active and approved 4-H Volunteer. Please log into your 4-H Online account and follow the steps below to take your training. You will see a Training tab upon submitting enrollment. Click the title of the training to select a lesson. Launch the course. *Note if you do not have Flash on your computer it will prompt you to allow it. This will then take you back to the previous screen where you will need to launch the course again to take it.**
