Non-Perishable

Friday, July 26th

State Fair non-perishable items are due to the Extension Office by 2:00 PM.

Perishable

Tuesday, July 30th

State Fair perishable items are due to the Extension Office by 2:00 PM.

Improving Your State Fair Eligible Projects

4-H'ers, you are encouraged to take home their Indiana State Fair eligible projects home to make any changes suggested by the county judges. Reviewing the scorecard and judges' notes will help you improve and get them ready for the state level competition. Extension Office personnel may transport exhibit items to/from State Fair as a courtesy. Large objects are the responsibility of the member.

4-H'ers who have not picked up their projects from the Fair are encouraged to come to the Extension office as soon as possible to collect them. We still have many projects that are waiting to be returned home.
